

Age


Male/Female

Overflowing bike racks at trip destinations.


Easy connections to nearby municipalities.

decreased congestion downtown / into + out of town


safer - roads, intersections + paths

town / region connected


broad public acceptance + education

Smaller cars - fewer cars downtown, Nassau street vibrant w/ people on the street. Bikers + Ped's being majority of street users in central business district.



(no leaves + dirt + garbage)




# What does success look like?

# What does success look like?


more one way streets






See people on the streets biking + walking


