#### **Juvenile Report-July 2014**

#### **Juveniles Petitioned in Family Court**

A sixteen year old female was charged with Possession of CDS (marijuana) and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia after she was located in the woods with three other individuals. Police responded to a report of suspicious individuals which led to the discovery.

#### **Curbside Warnings**

A fifteen year old boy shoved his eighteen year old brother in Hind's Plaza after accusing him of spending time with his ex-girlfriend. No injury occurred and the juvenile was left in the custody of his father who was on scene.

#### **Family Crisis or Mental Health Incidents**

A mother reported her seventeen year old son was verbally abusive, did not follow household rules and was not complying with school ordered substance abuse counseling. Detective Henderson held a conference with the mother and son to aid in refocusing him and he returned to the required counseling.

#### **DCP&P Referrals (formerly DYFS)**

A school official reported that a 29 year old male was spending time late into the night with two male students ages 12 and 13 years old, causing them to have excessive absences from school. The boys denied inappropriate or criminal behavior by the adult in question and the investigation was turned over to DCP&P.

**July 1**<sup>st</sup>- SNB held a preparation meeting with the Recreation Department to discuss the upcoming Community Night Out.


July 10<sup>th</sup>- SNB attended the annual Palmer Square Waiters Race.

# Total Arrests










**Total - Parking Violations** 2014
