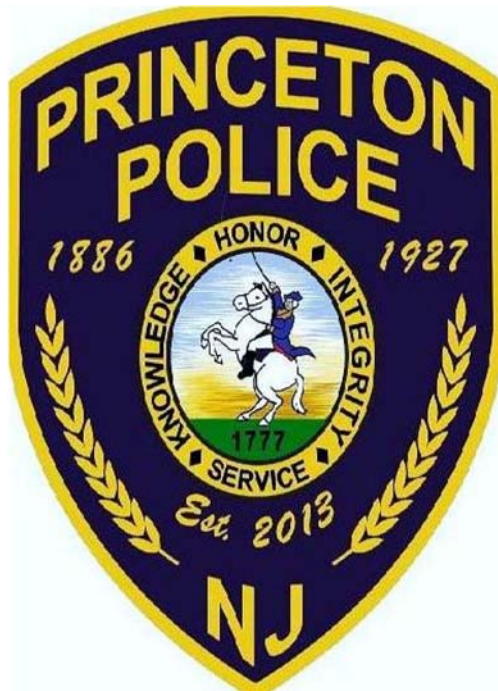

Juveniles Afforded a Station House Adjustment

Two seventeen year old boys shoplifted several items from the Princeton University Store.

Family Crisis or Mental Health Incidents

A seventeen year old boy and his mother engaged in an argument over chores. The family was advised of services that provide family counseling at the home.

A seventeen year old boy and his mother engaged in an argument after he left the house to go to a friend's as opposed to being at an AA meeting as he stated. Resource information was provided for the Mobile Response and Stabilization Services that provide family counseling at the home.

A sixteen year old girl overdosed on prescription medication and was hospitalized for a period of time to facilitate her recovery.

A sixteen year old girl ran away from home for a period of four days. She was located by police and transported to the University Medical Center at Princeton for a psychological evaluation due to recent erratic behavior.

A mother reported her seventeen year old daughter had been missing from home for fourteen days. She believed she was staying with her boyfriend and the daughter returned home the next day after the incident was reported to the police.

A fifteen year old boy pushed his mother during an argument. Resources were provided for the Mobile Response and Stabilization Services that provides family counseling at the home.

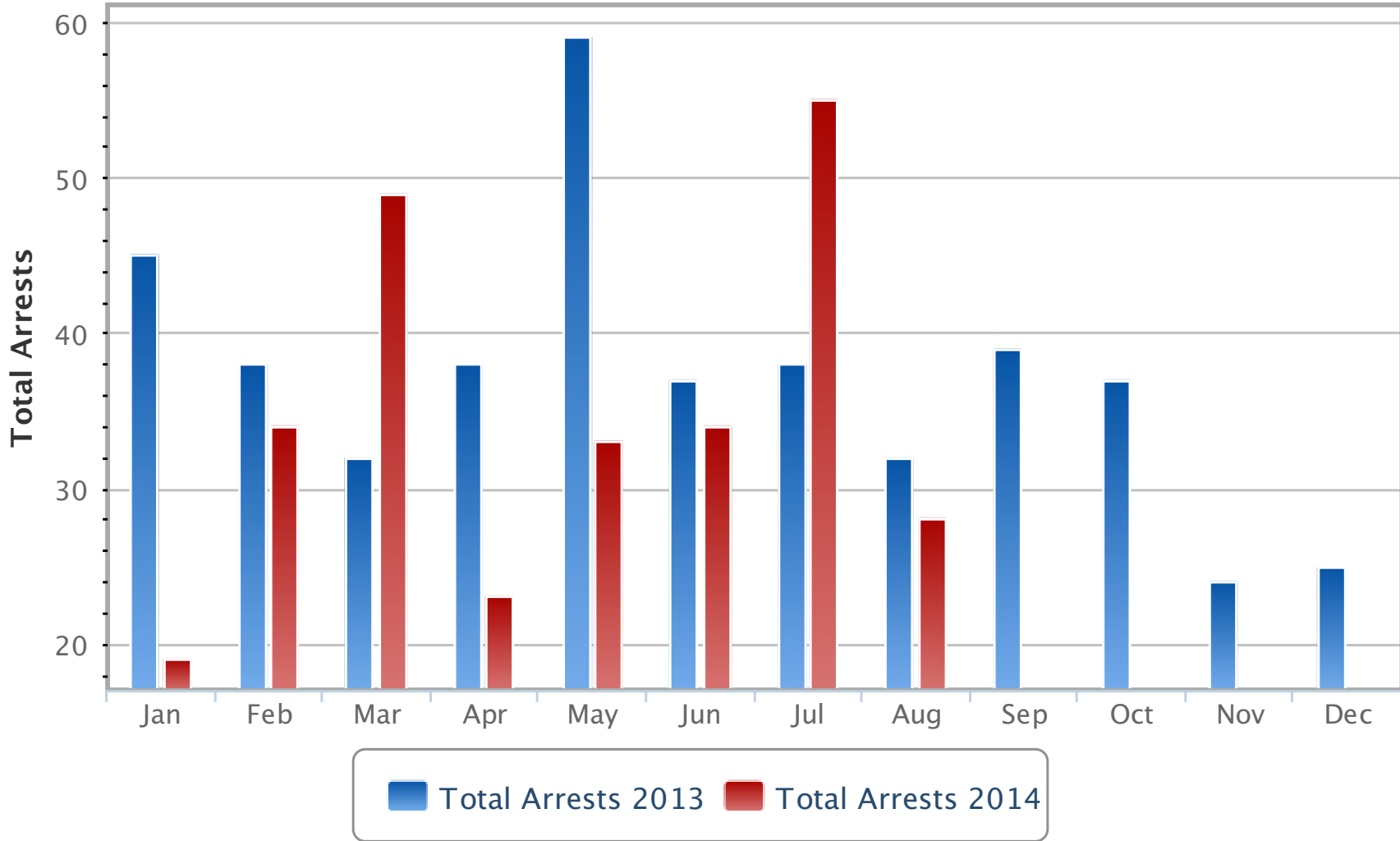
August 1st- SNB conducted a tour of the police station for the YWCA ESL group. There were approximately 15 individuals from different countries including China, Italy and the Ukraine.

August 5th- In conjunction with the Princeton Recreation Department SNB organized the Community Night Out. The event took place at the Princeton Community Park Pool. There were numerous attractions for all who attended. Approximately 1,500 hotdogs were cooked by members of the police department and served to the community free of charge.

August 18-22- SNB organized and conducted our annual Princeton Youth Academy. There were 32 boys and girls who attended the week long academy. During the week there were several blocks of instruction that were covered. The attendees learned about crime scene investigation, accident investigation, the legal system, first aid/first responder training and other areas related to police work. Additionally, there were special presentations conducted by Cpl. Solovay (K-9 officer), the NJ State Police Aviation Unit, the Princeton Fire Department and the Princeton First Aid and Rescue Squad. The week concluded with a trip to the NJ State Police Museum followed by a formal graduation ceremony. The bonds made between the officers and students are instrumental to our community policing philosophy.

August 24th- SNB assisted the Recreation Dept with the Splash and Dash Aquathon.

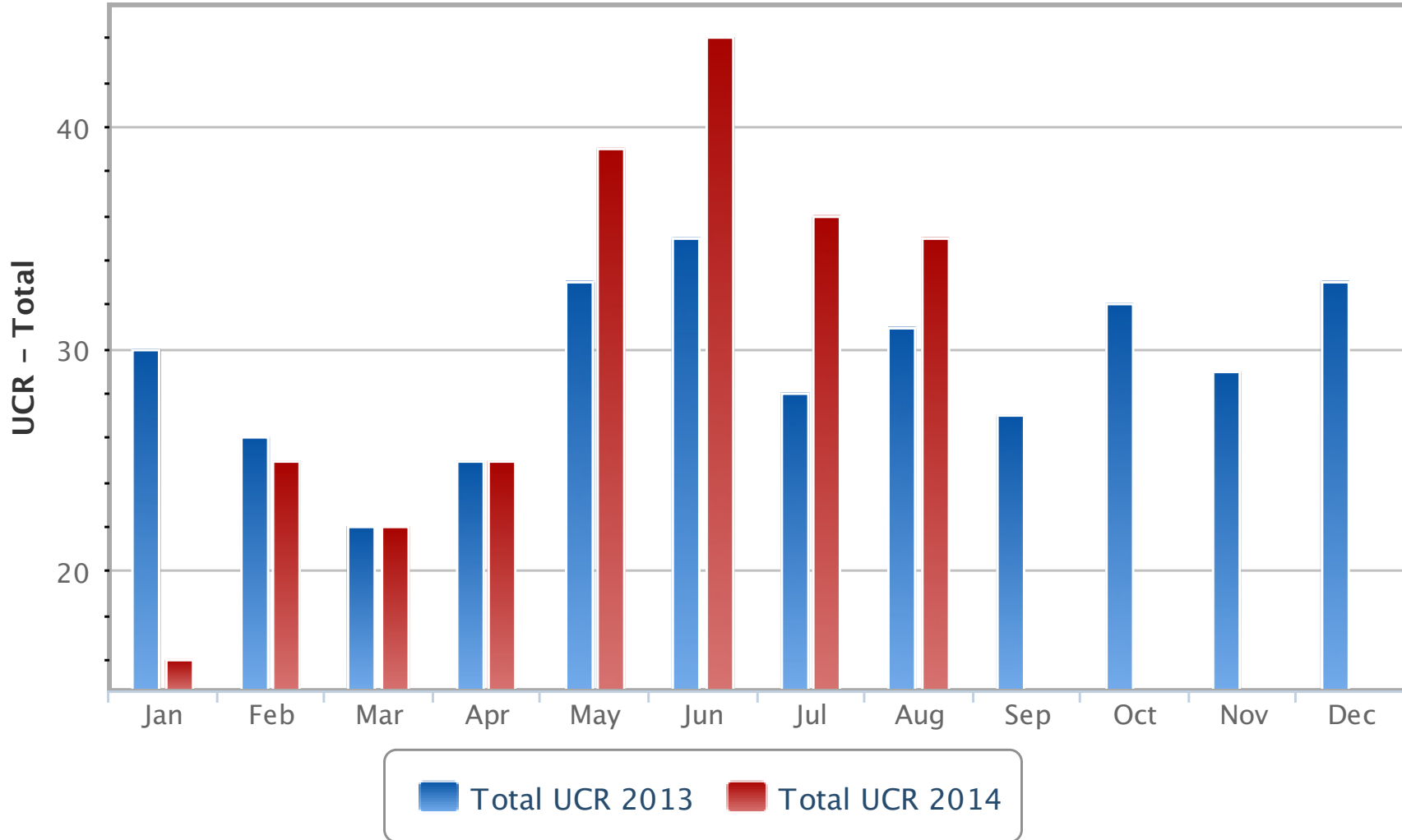

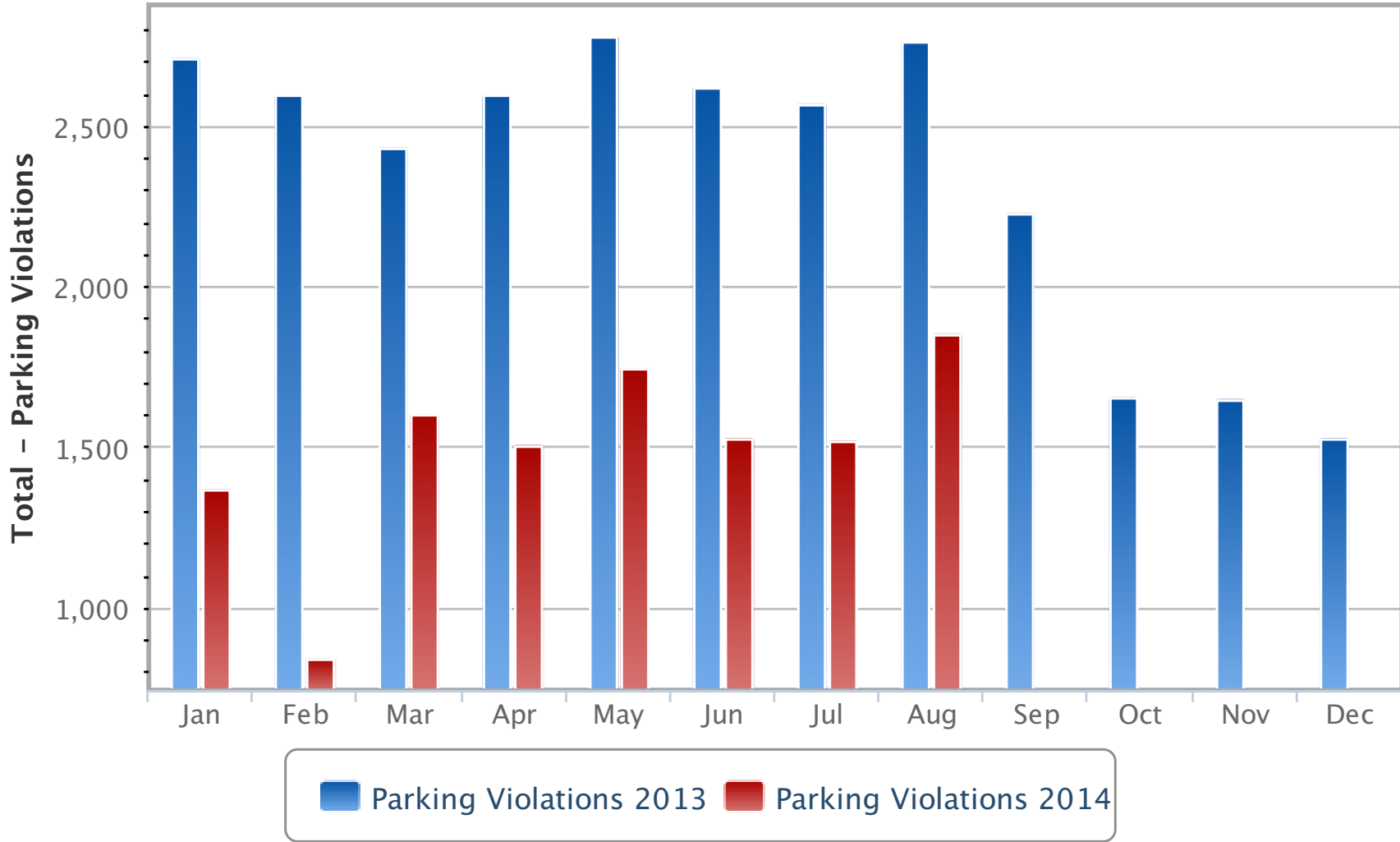

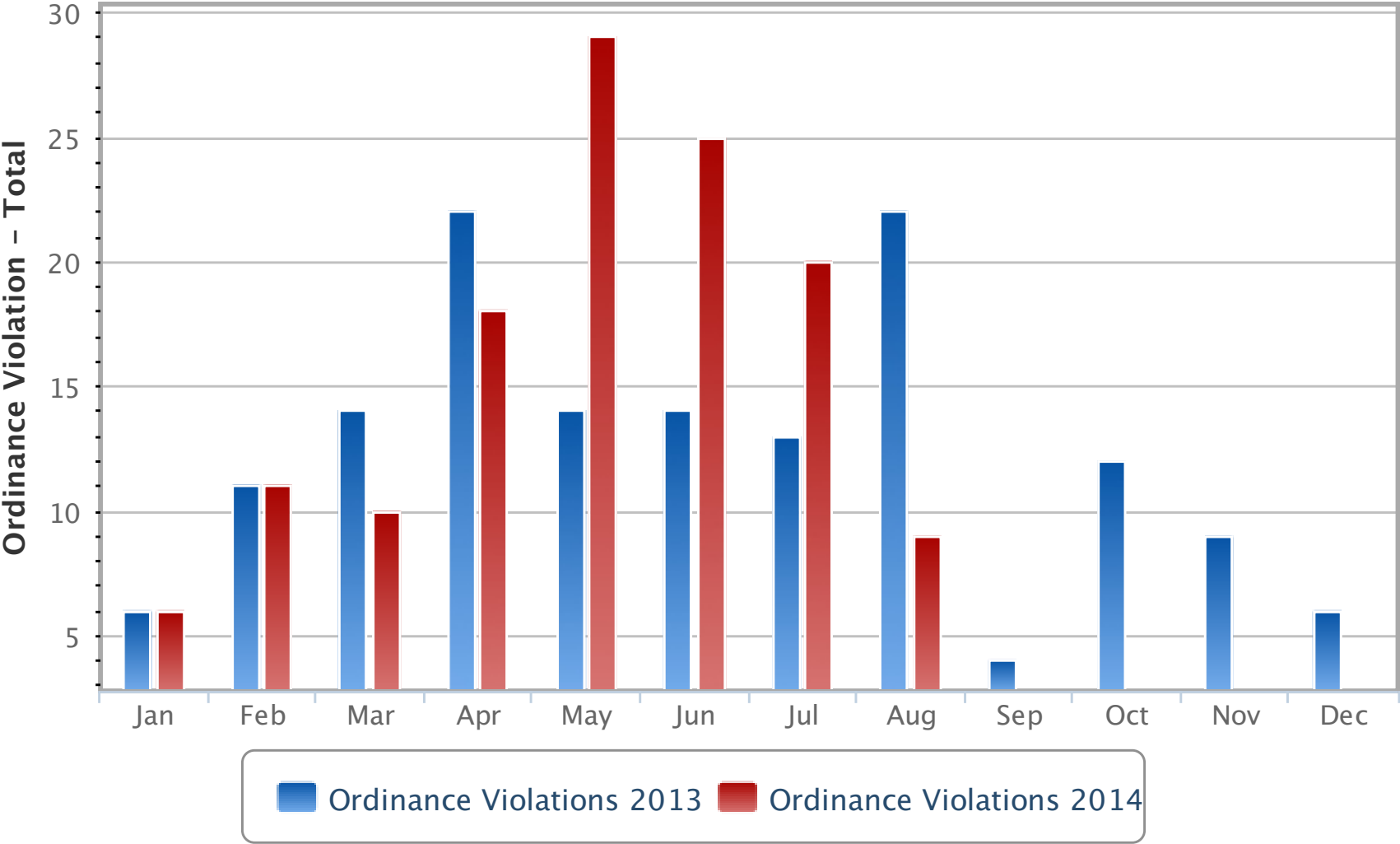

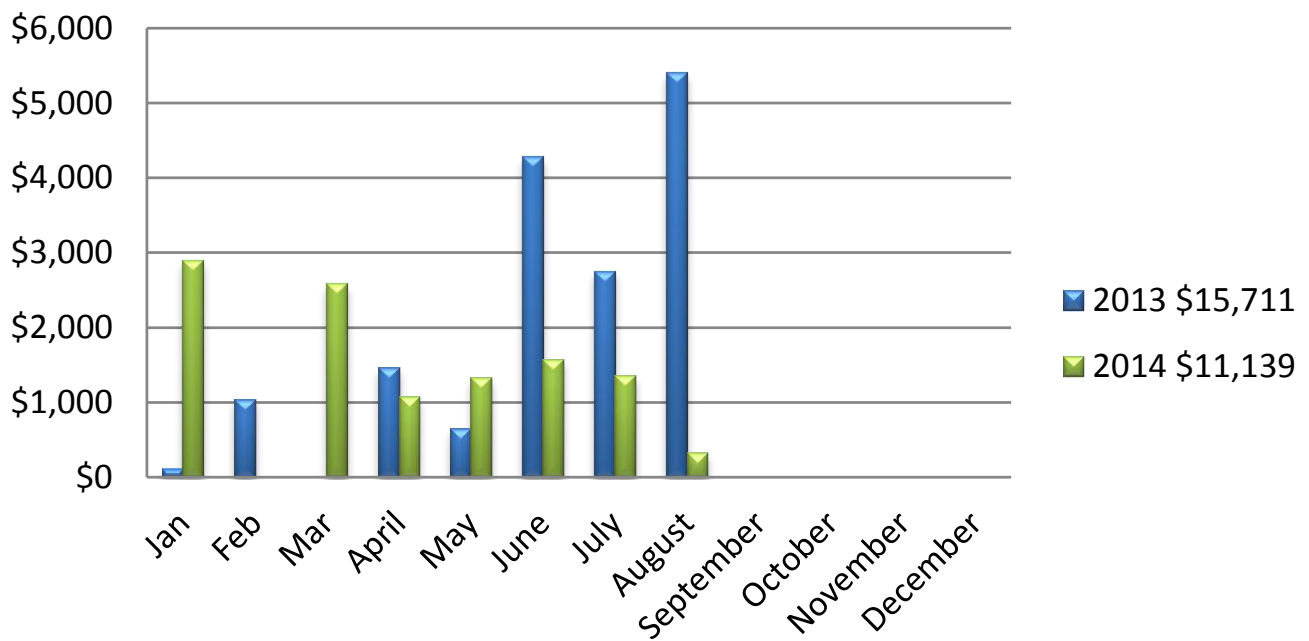
Patrol Overtime



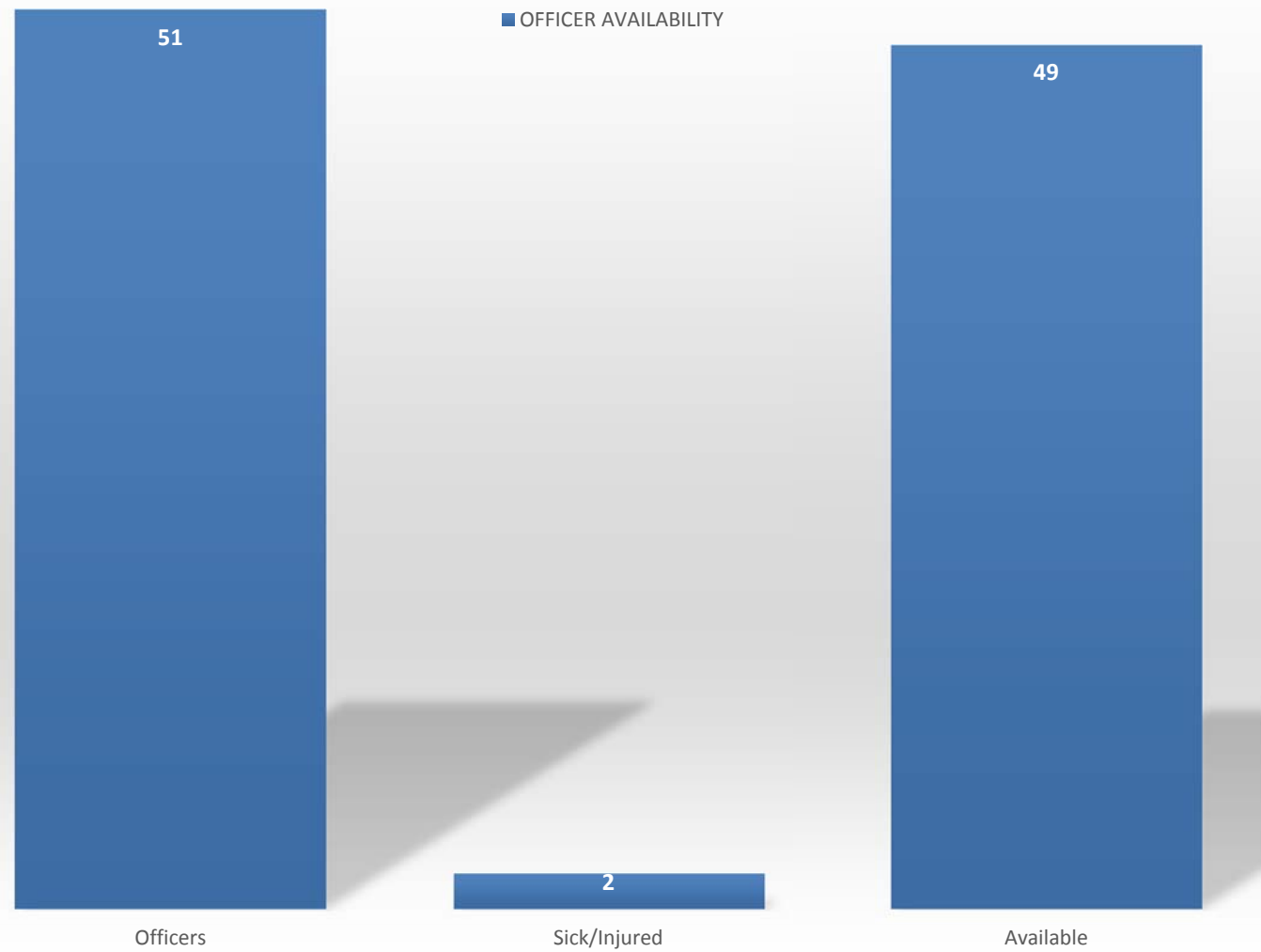
Dispatch Overtime
