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Juvenile Report-February 2016

Juveniles Charged in Family Court

A fourteen year old boy was charged with two counts of Criminal Mischief and Defiant Trespass after accessing the roof of a Nassau Street building and spray painting graffiti. On another occasion he gained access to the roof and purposely dumped a bucket of oil on the lower roof while his friend videotaped the act.

A fourteen year old boy was charged with Defiant Trespass and Criminal Mischief after he accessed a Nassau Street building and spray painted graffiti. He was additionally charged with Defiant Trespass, Complicity to Criminal Mischief and Hindering Apprehension for accessing the roof on another occasion and participating in the plan to dump a bucket of oil on the roof while he videotaped it to post on social media and providing false information to police. He had previously been granted a Station House Adjustment which was subsequently withdrawn.

Juveniles Afforded a Station House Adjustment

A 15 year old boy and two 14 year old boys accessed the roof of a building on Nassau Street in an act of Defiant Trespass and were afforded Station House Adjustments.

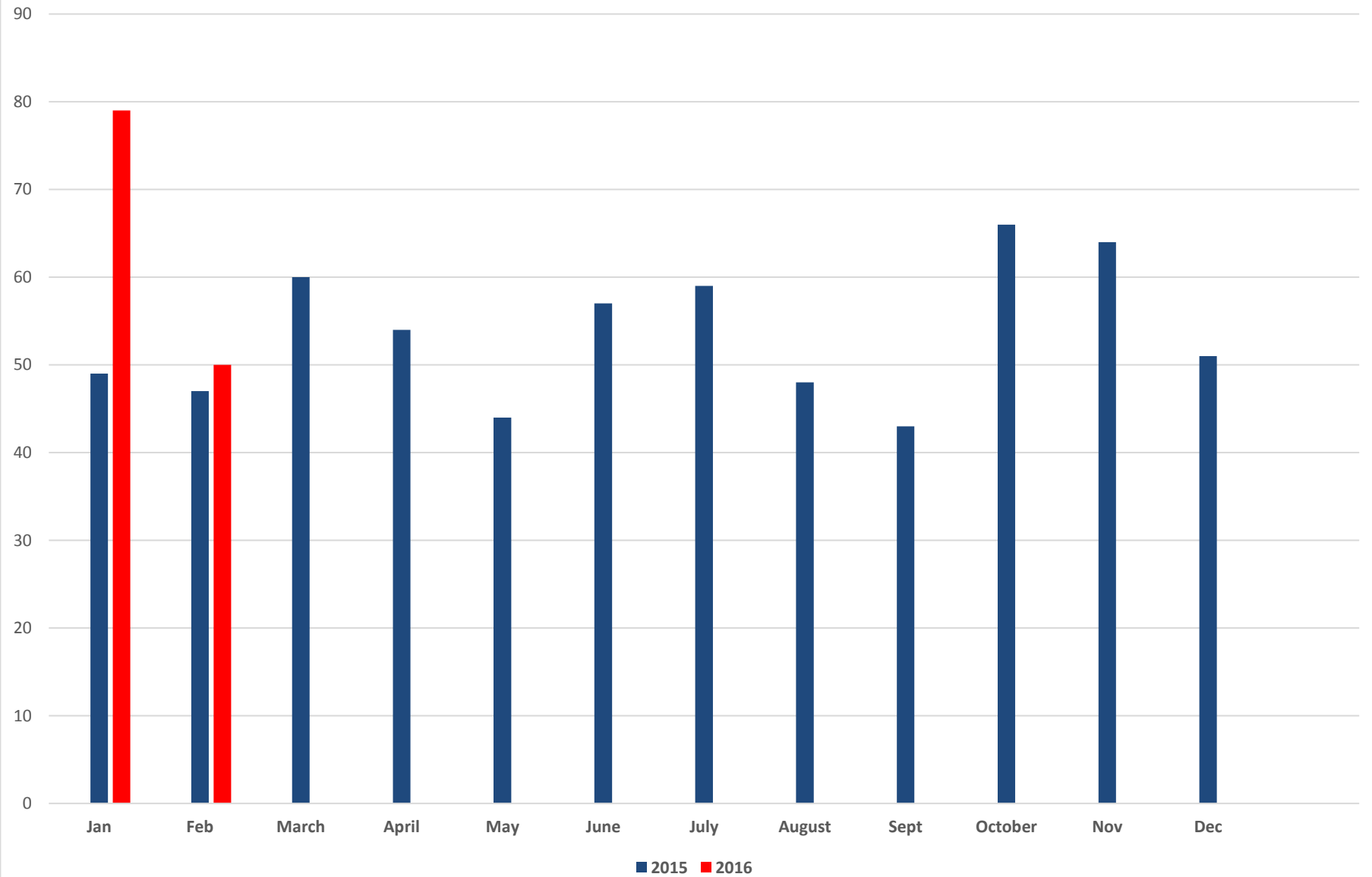
A 17 year old boy was afforded a Station House Adjustment after making harassing comments while engaging in a verbal argument with his former girlfriend in the cafeteria of the Princeton High School.

DCP&P Referrals

After responding to a domestic dispute in which a child was present a referral was made to DCP&P. DCP&P responded and due to a variety of factors, removed the child from the home.

A DCP&P referral was made after a six year old child was struck in the head by his father during a domestic dispute.

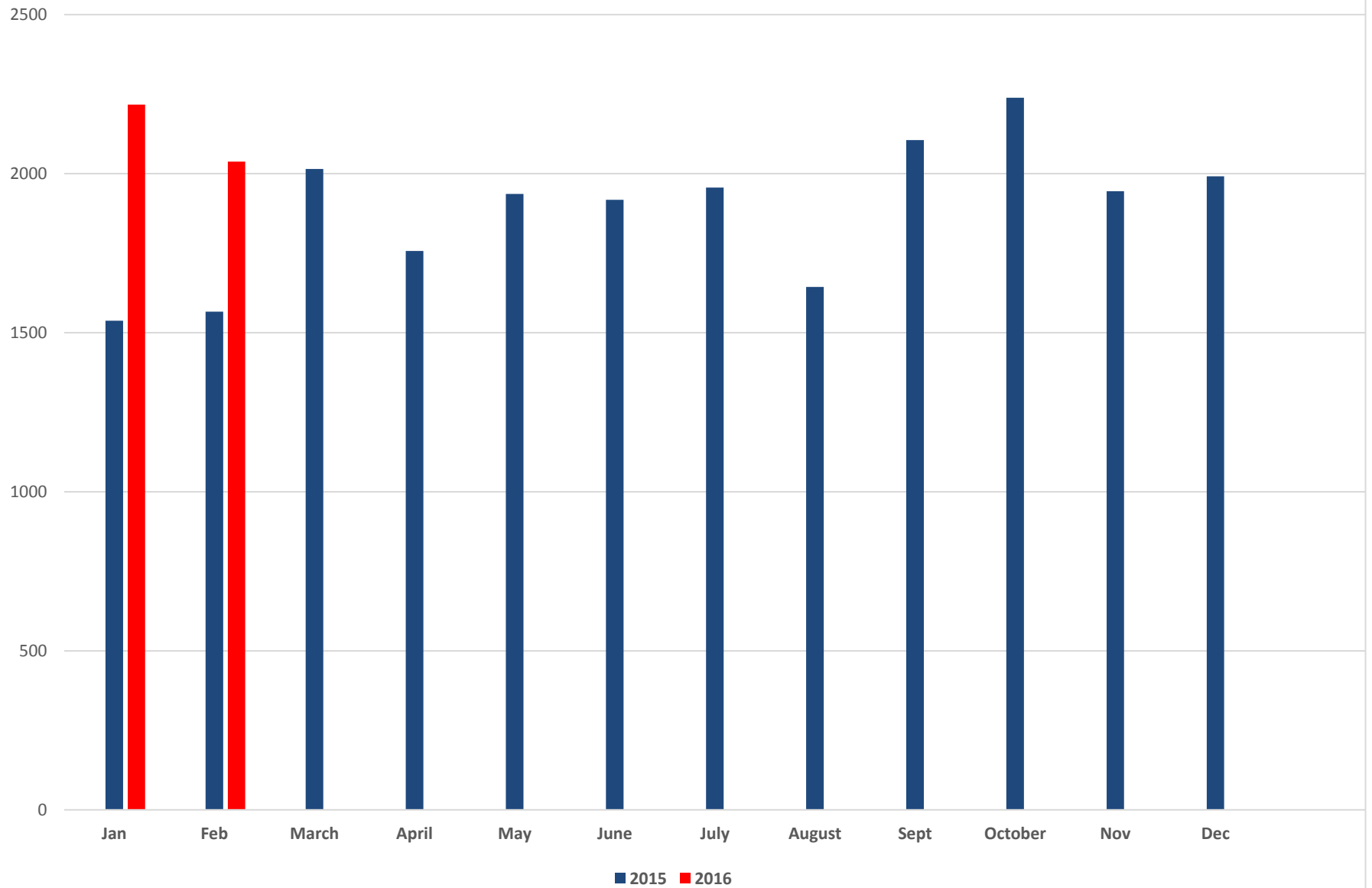

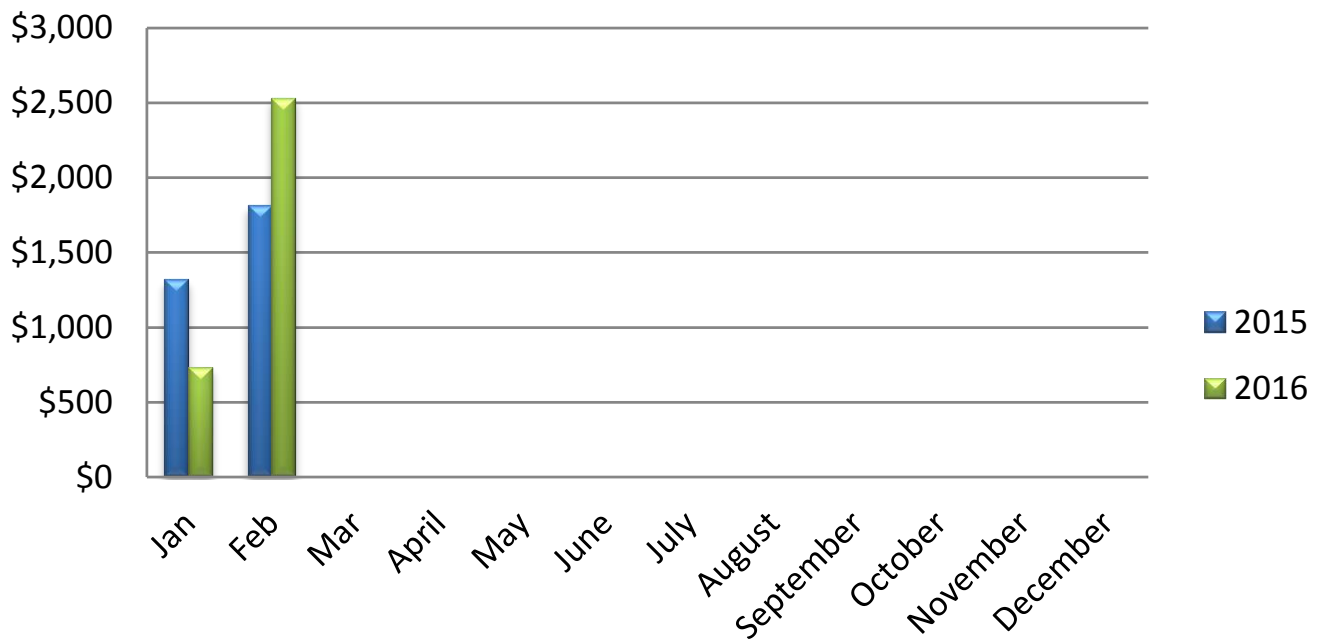
Patrol Overtime

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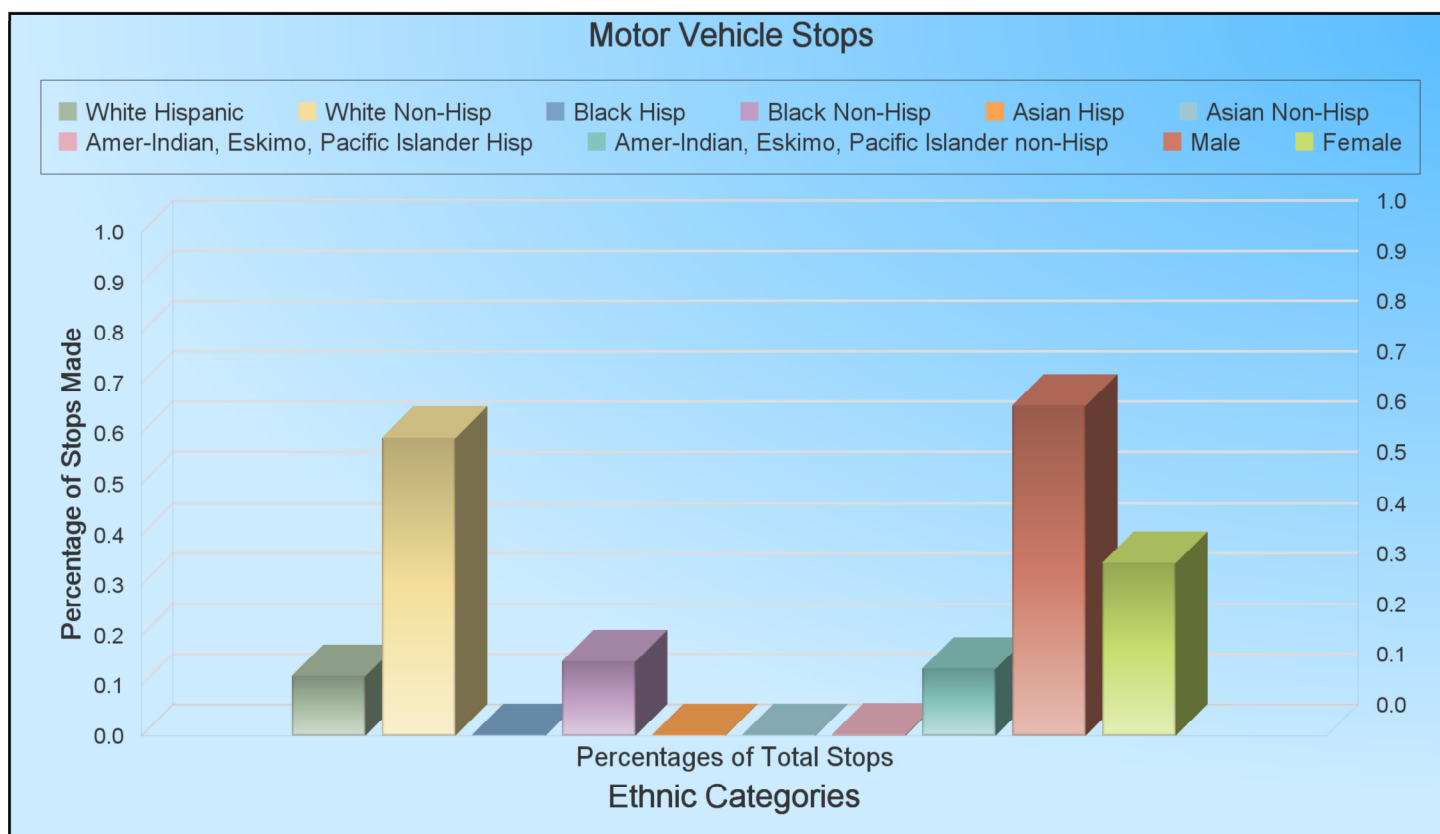
