90 day Registration conducted for a Tier II Sex Offender.

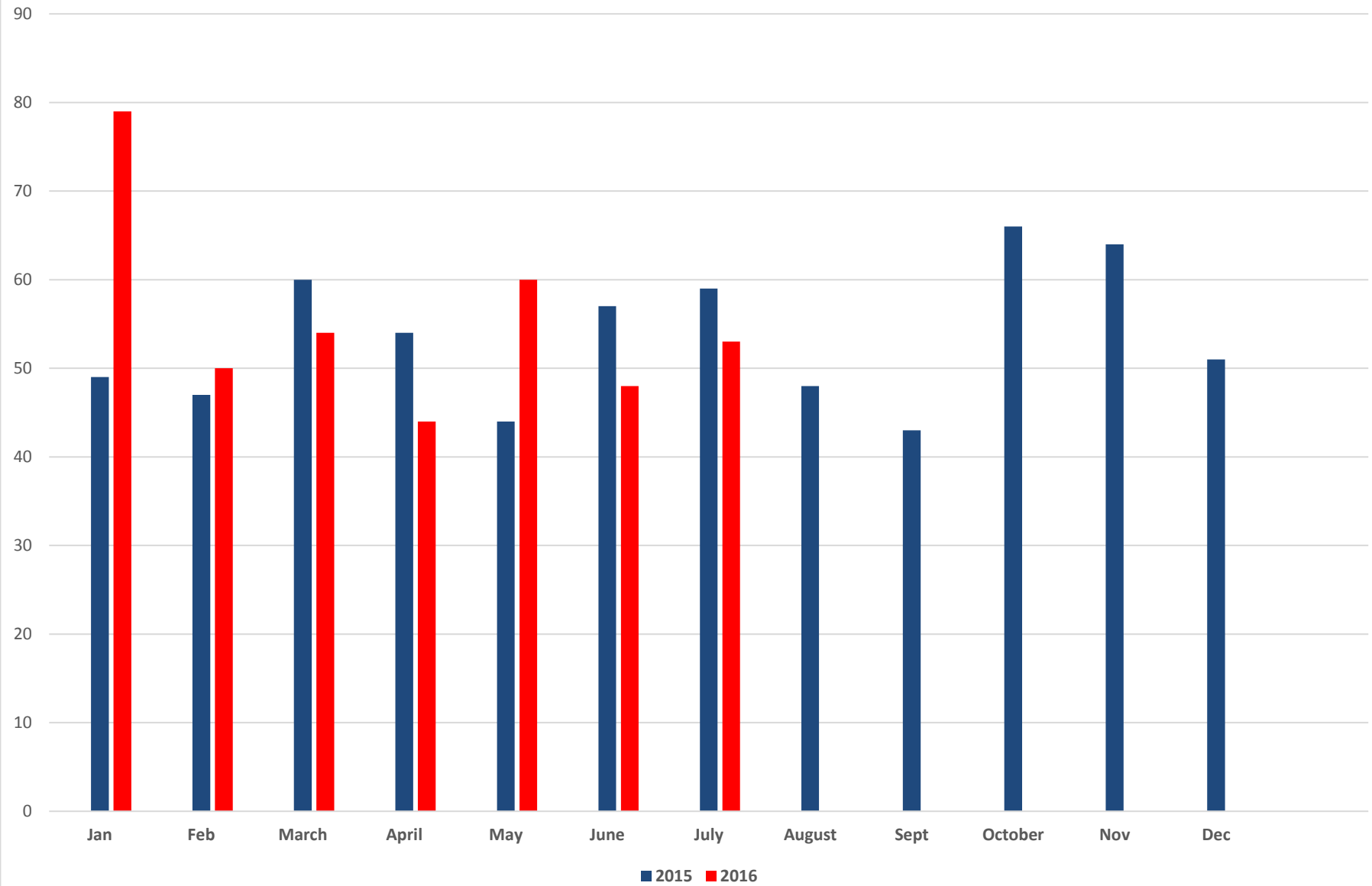
A Tier II Sex Offender was charged with Failure to Notify of Address Change after it was discovered he had moved to another jurisdiction and also failed to register with that police department.

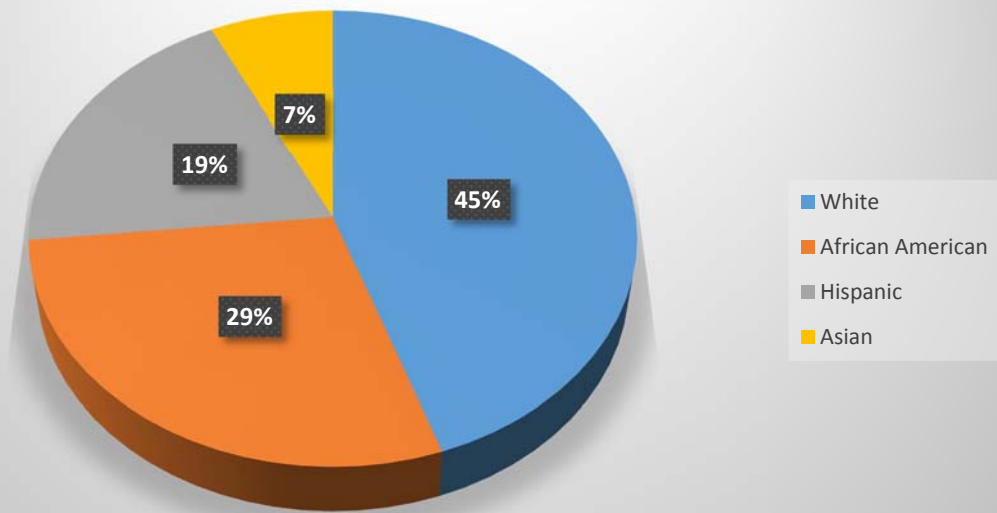

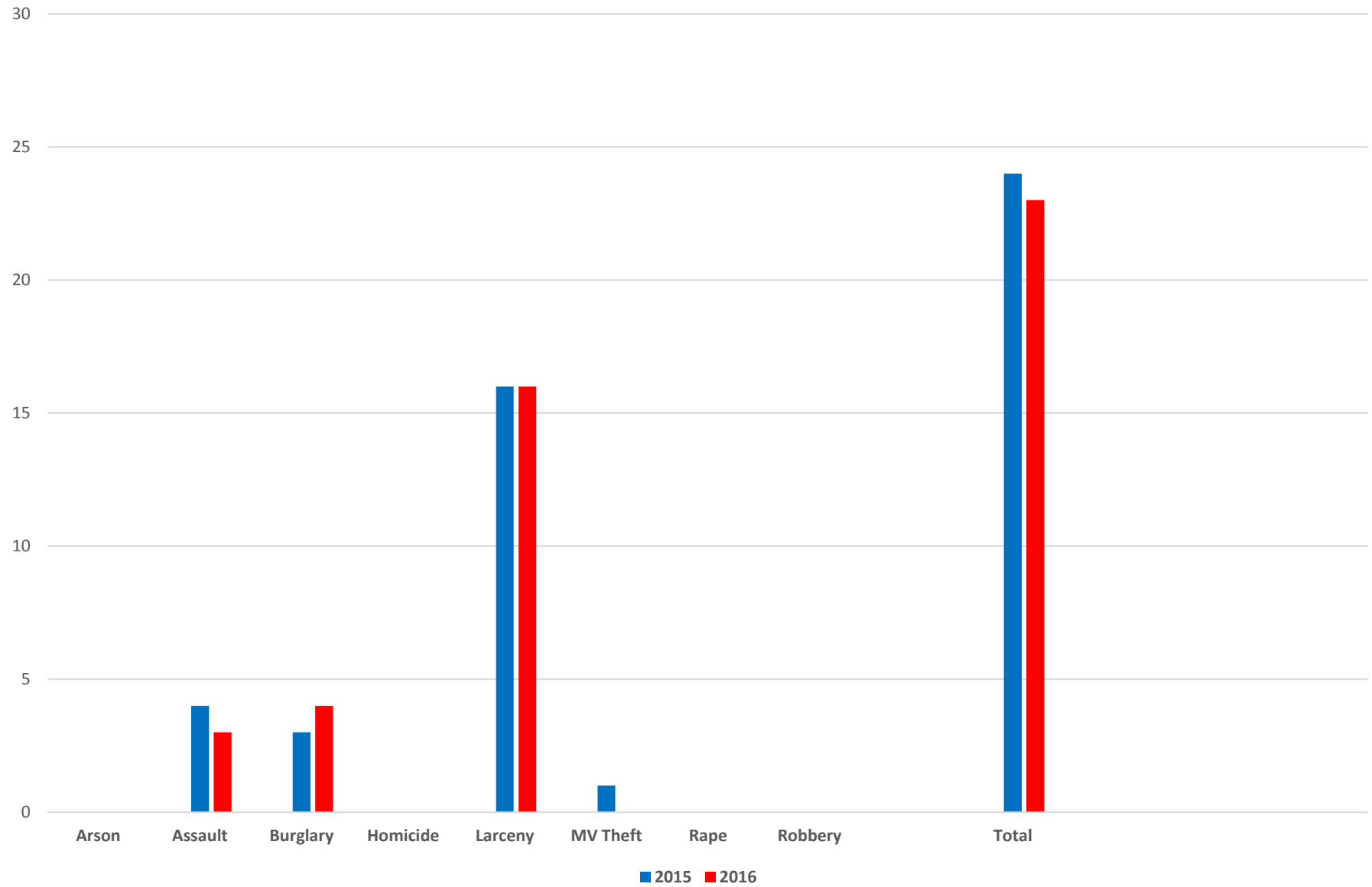

2016 YEAR TO DATE ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS



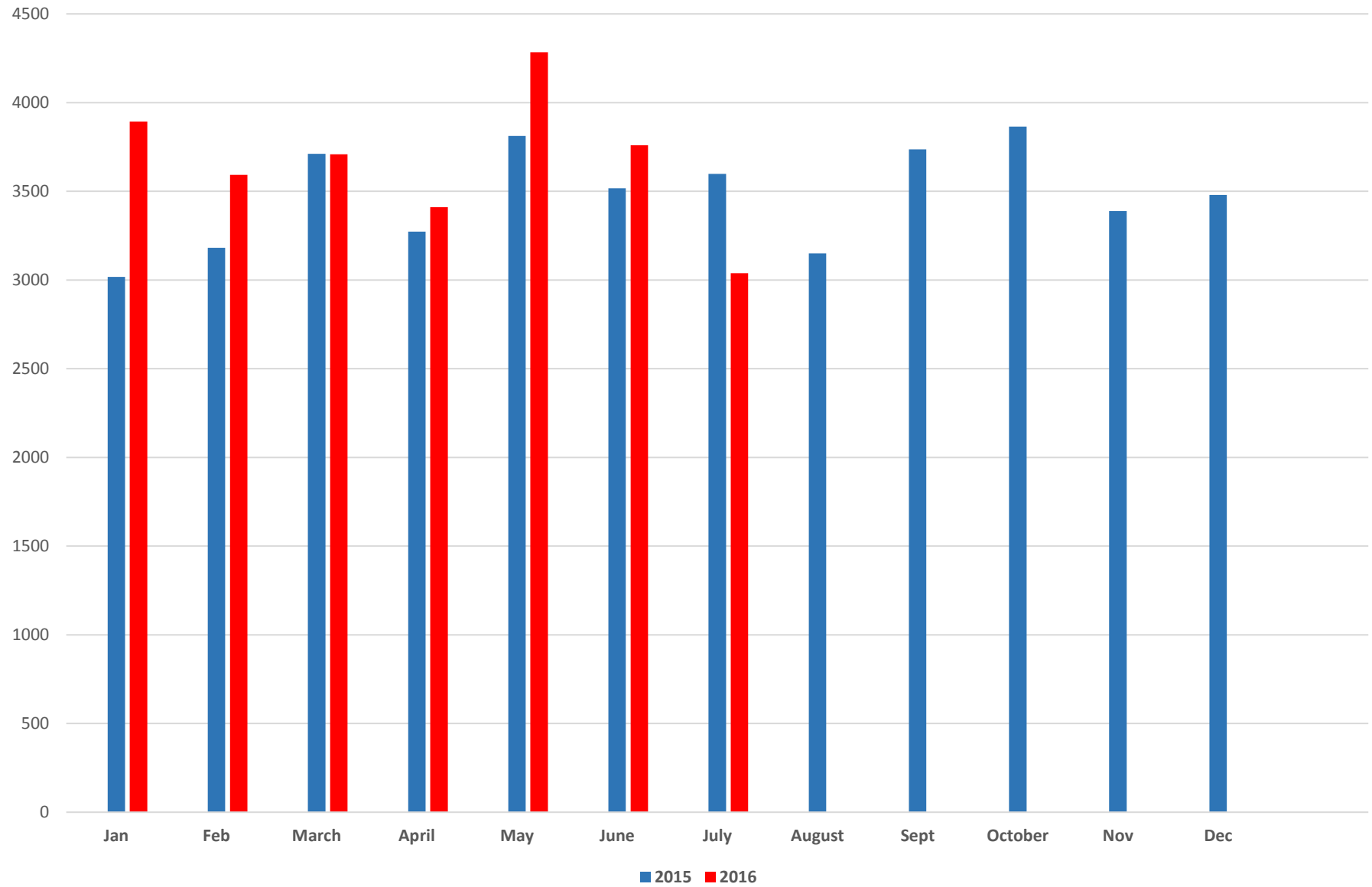

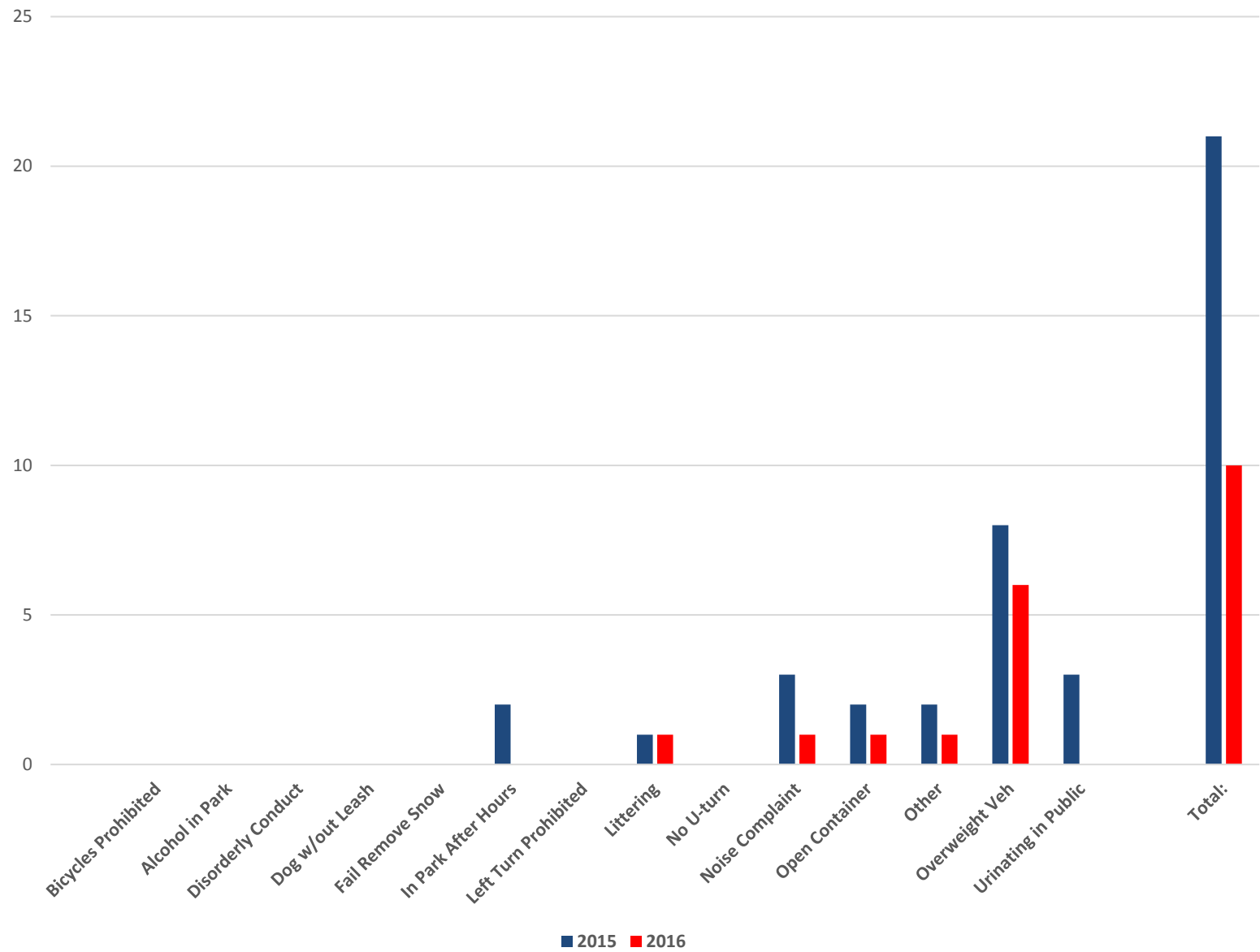

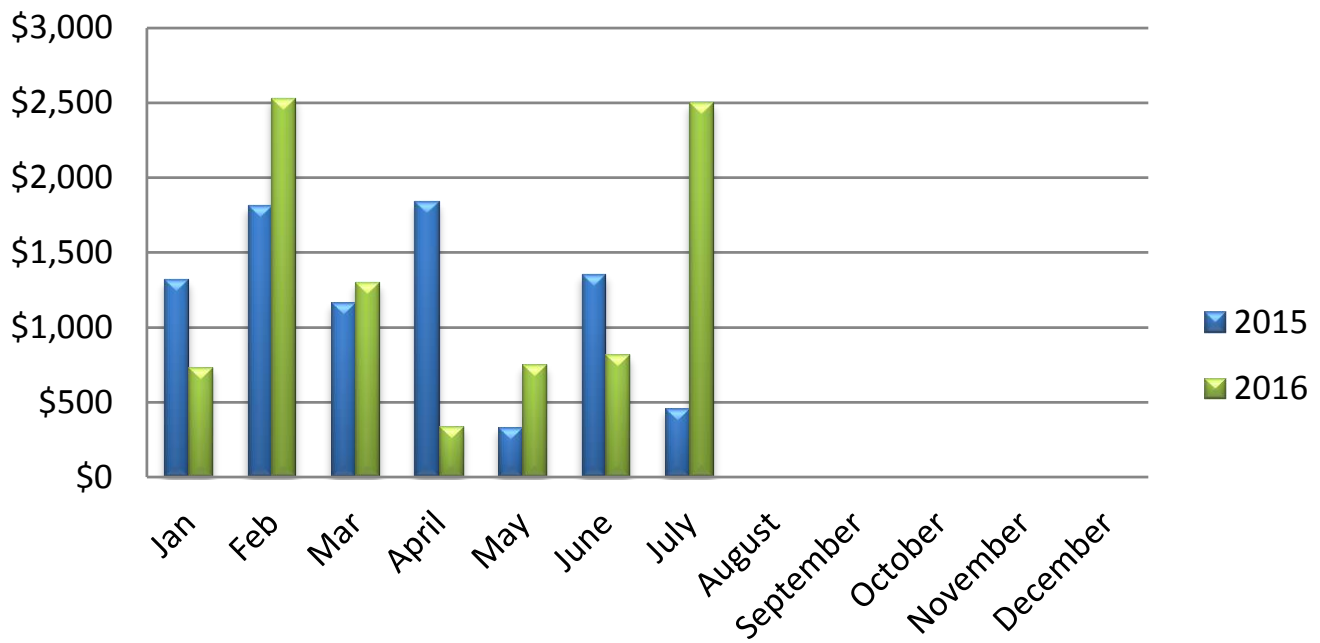
Patrol Overtime

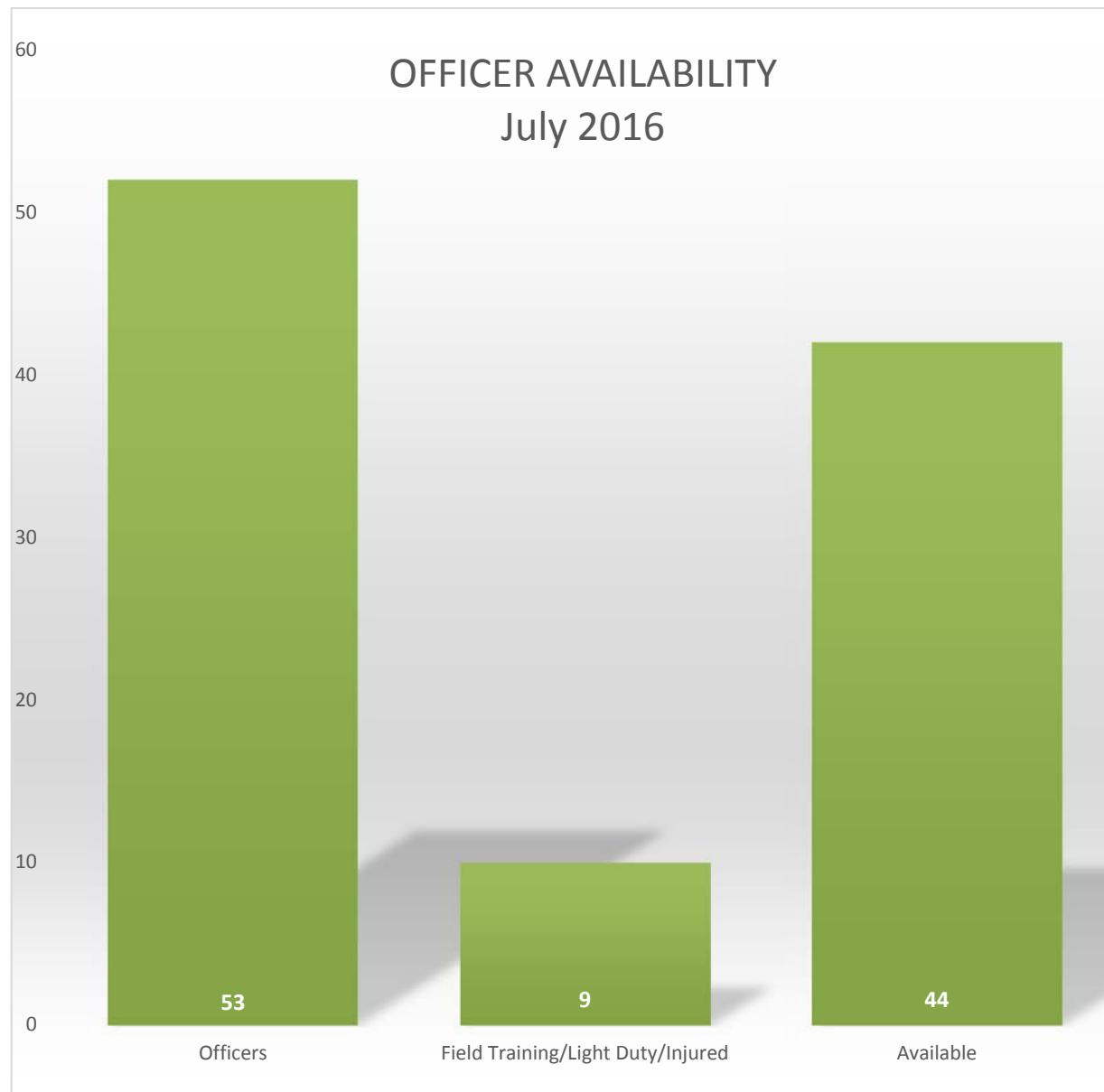


Dispatch Overtime

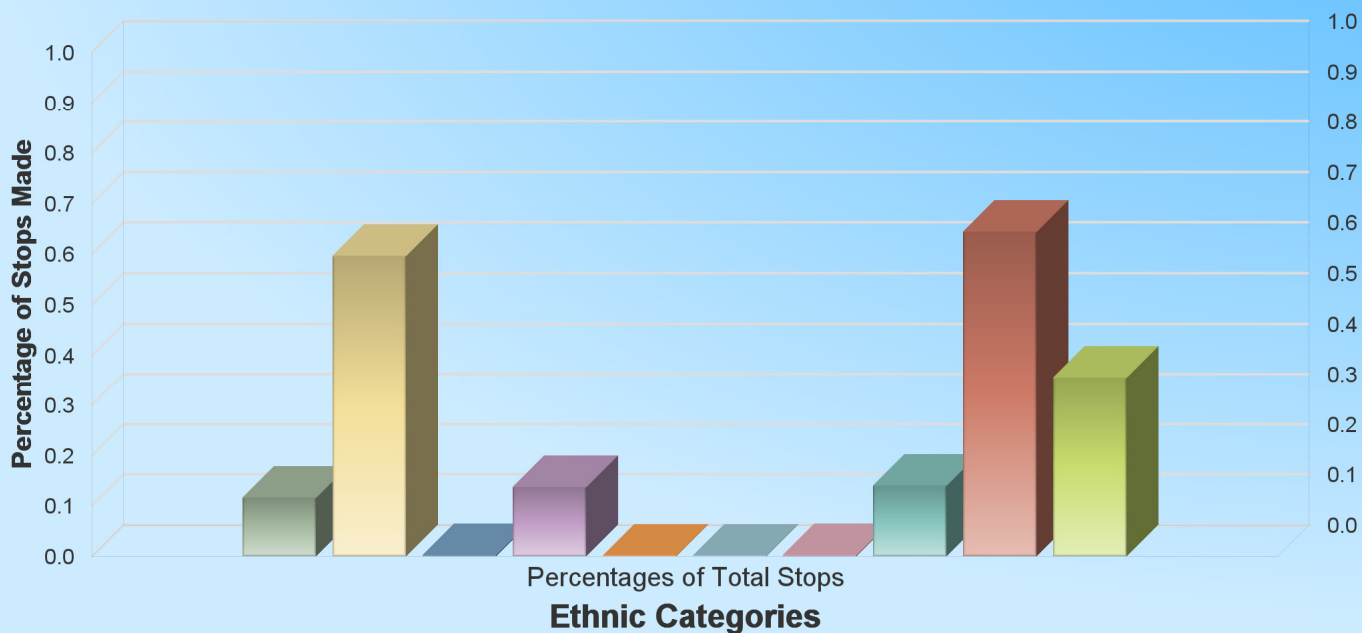

- ❖ On Saturday, July 9, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris were called to the scene of a disabled, heavily damaged vehicle that was stopped in the middle of the lane of travel on South Harrison St. Responding officers found the vehicle unoccupied, but believed that the operator had recently left the scene. Believing the operator could have been injured in a recent crash or other possible activity, a K-9 track of the subject was attempted. However, while actively tracking, the operator contacted police headquarters and later returned to the scene.
- ❖ On Tuesday, July 12, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended in-service training for the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force at West Windsor-Plainsboro South High School in West Windsor, NJ. The training was hosted by the West Windsor Police Department and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit.
- ❖ On July 27th, 28th, and 29th, the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force was activated. Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris assisted the New Jersey State Police with conducting K-9 explosive sweeps at the PGA Championship Golf Event at Baltusrol Country Club in Springfield, NJ.



- ❖ On Thursday, July 28, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a K-9 demonstration at Community Park South in correlation with the “Cops N’ Campers” event. This new event was organized jointly by the Princeton Police Department and the Princeton Recreation Department. Sgt. Solovay provided a lecture about the K-9 Program discussing the tremendous advantages that the K-9 Unit brings to the police department and the community. The campers were also provided with a demonstration involving explosives detection, obedience, agility, and criminal apprehension. Other activities included tours of the police station and police vehicles, as well as officers interacting with the campers and playing games. Officers also grilled hot dogs and had lunch with the campers.
