Juvenile Report-June 2016

Juveniles Petitioned to Family Court

A fourteen year old boy was charged with Aggravated Sexual Assault and Endangering the Welfare of a minor.

A fifteen year old boy was charged with Possession of Marijuana.

A fourteen year old boy and a thirteen year old boy were charged with Disorderly Conduct for throwing rocks at a pedestrian on Nassau Street. This was the second charge for the fourteen year old for the same conduct.

The same thirteen and fourteen year old boys were charged with Criminal Mischief after purposely destroying flowers belonging to the Princeton Public Library on a separate occasion.

A seventeen year old boy was charged with multiple counts of Criminal Trespass for entering the girls' bathrooms at two local schools on various occasions and masturbating in the stalls.

A seventeen year old boy was charged with Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia after it was located in his backpack.

Juveniles Afforded a Station House Adjustment

A fourteen year old boy was afforded a Station House Adjustment for Simple Assault after pushing a twelve year old boy in an ongoing conflict.

A seventeen year old girl was afforded a Station House Adjustment after entering the Princeton High School through a window when it was closed, thereby setting off the burglary alarm.

At the victim's request, a fourteen year old boy was afforded a Station House Adjustment after biting and pushing a Teacher's Aid at the John Witherspoon Middle School.

An eight year old boy ran away from his parent. He was subsequently located by patrols and reunited with his mother.

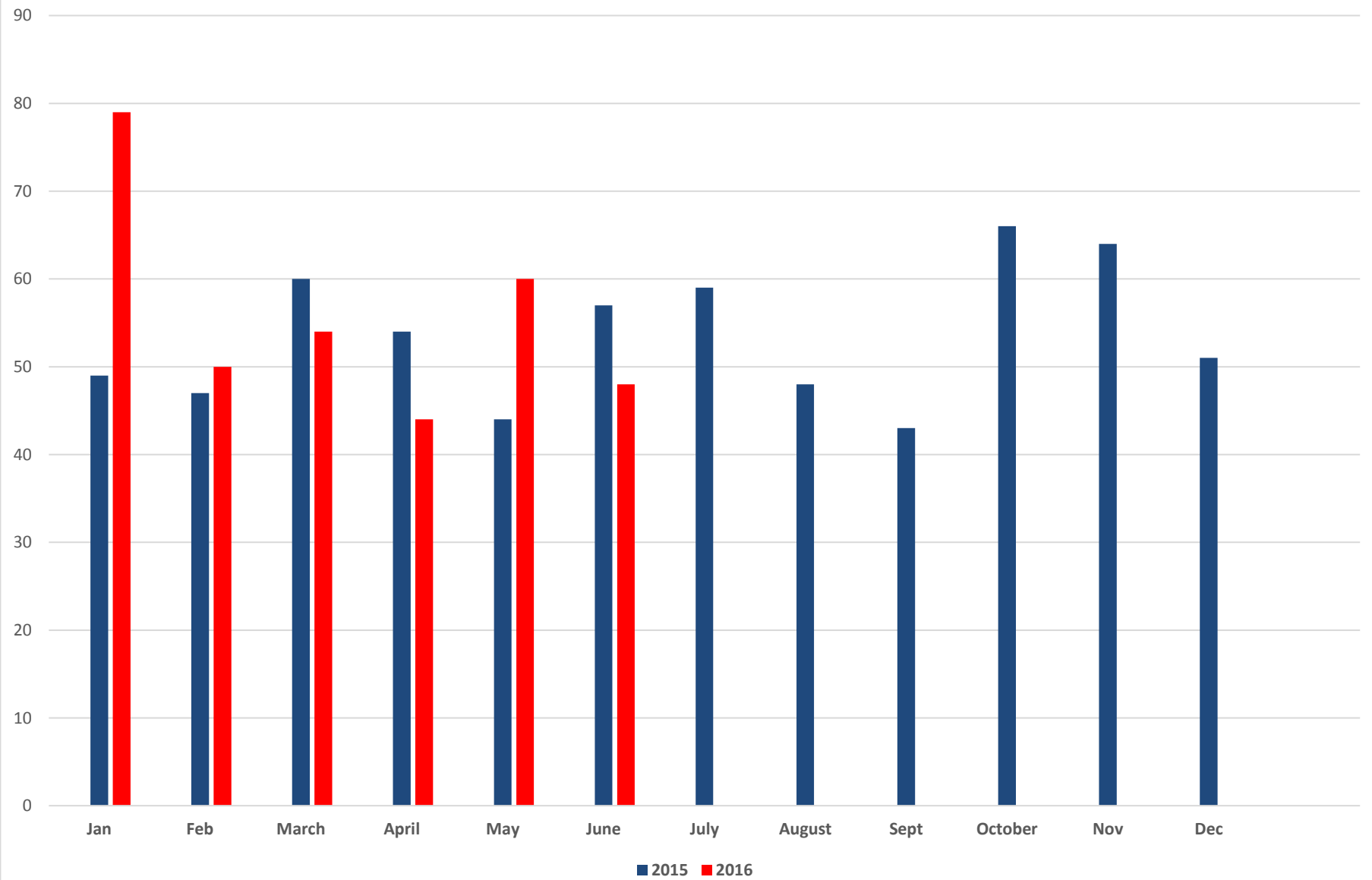
Referral to DCP&P for 9 year old boy who reported his father caused a scrape on his arm.

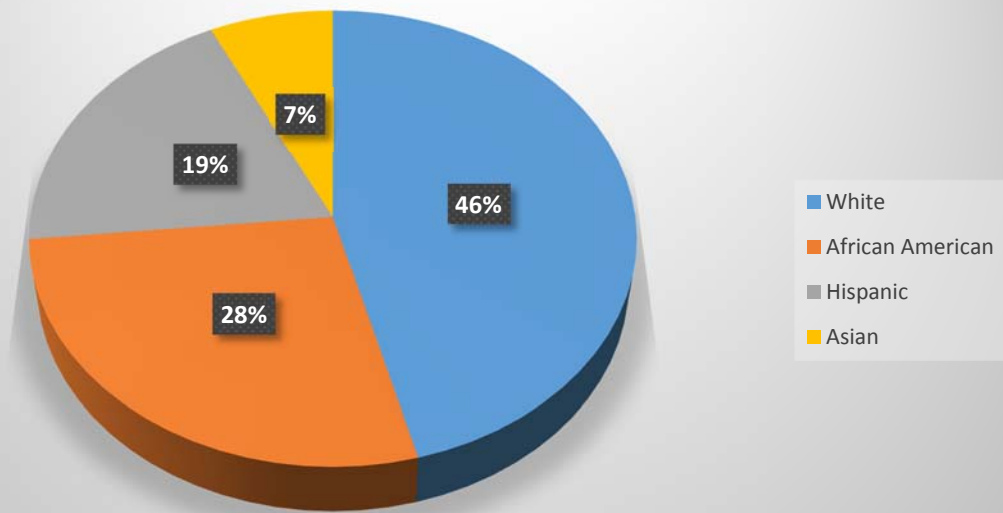

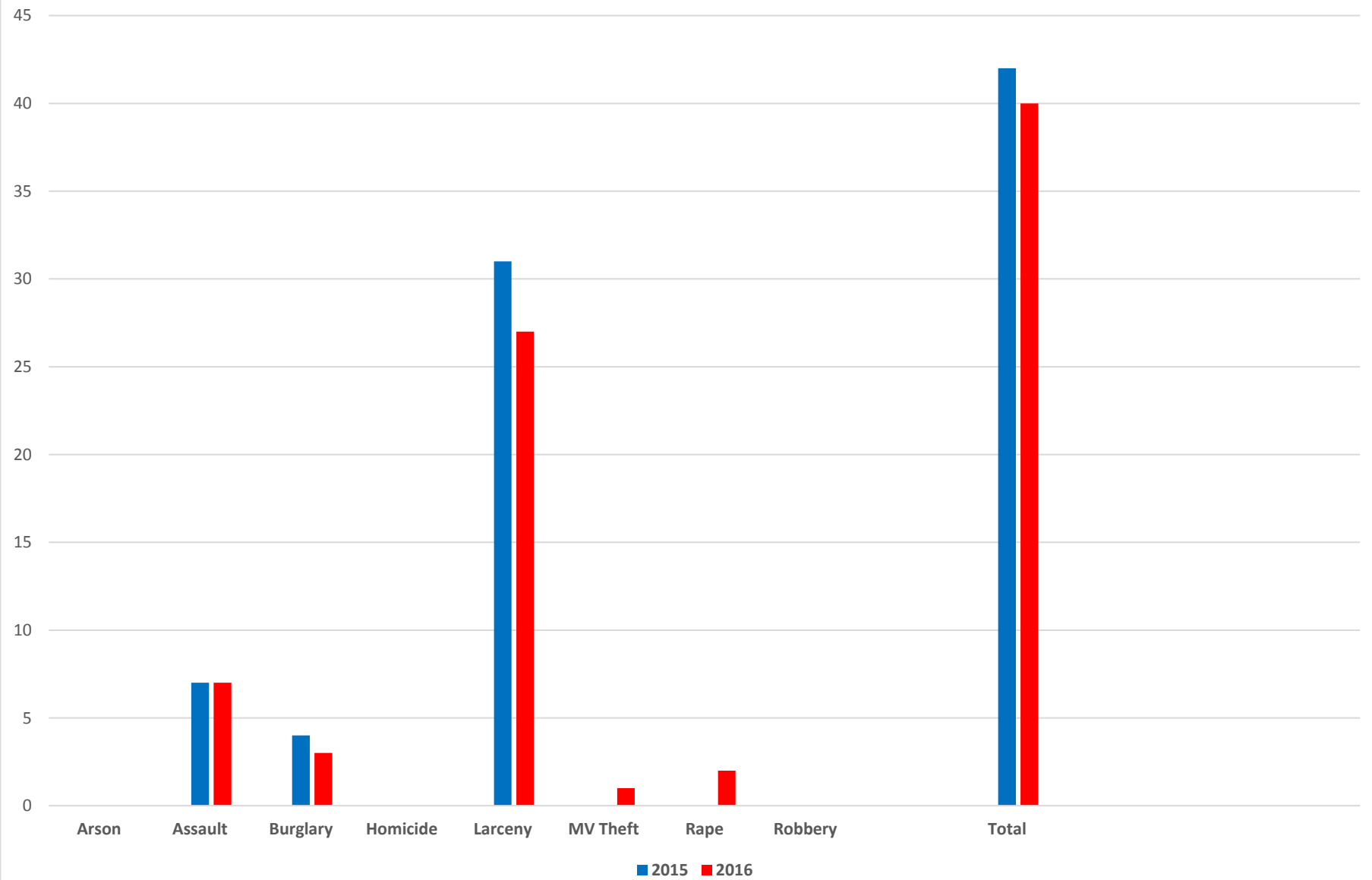

2016 YEAR TO DATE ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS



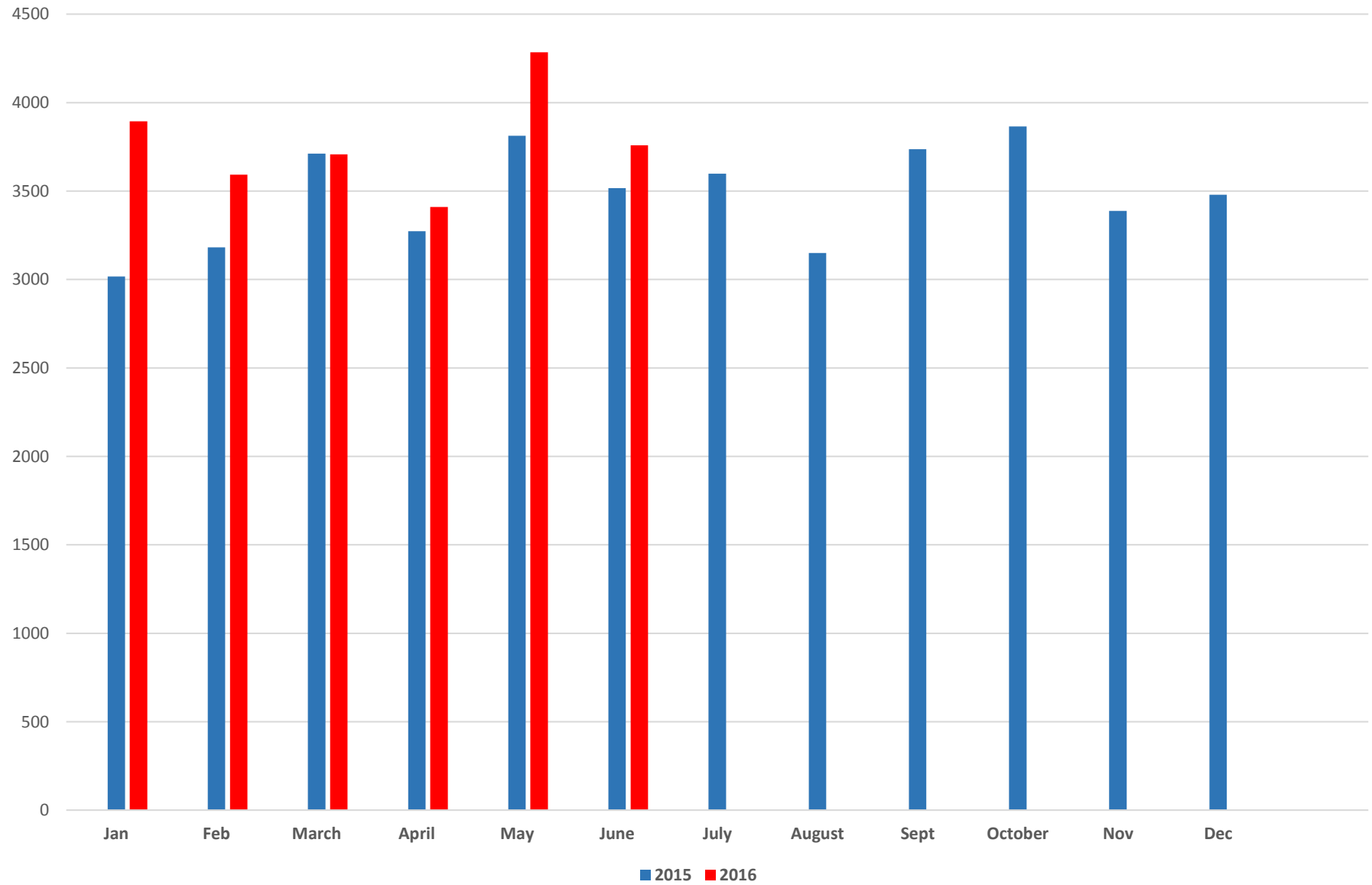

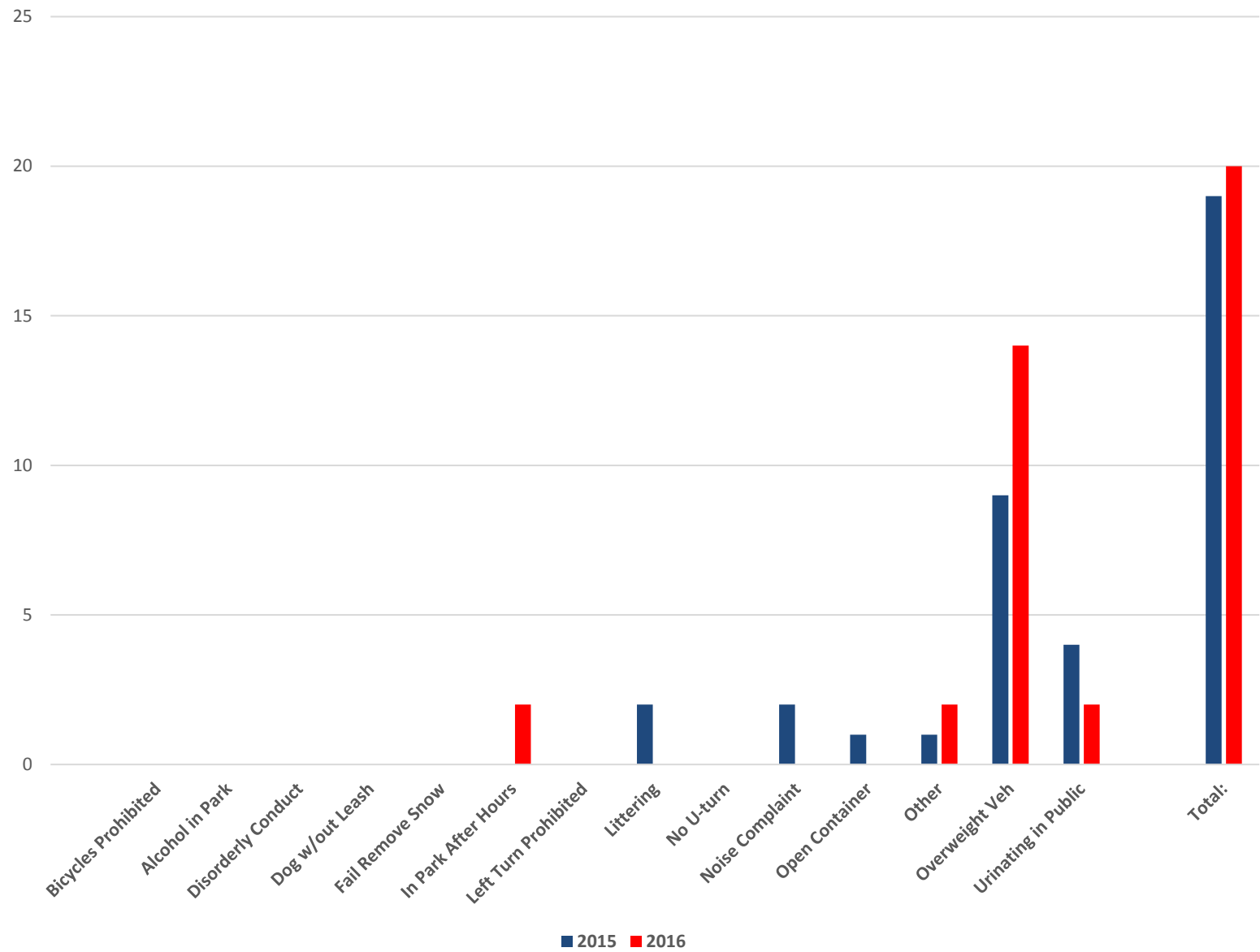

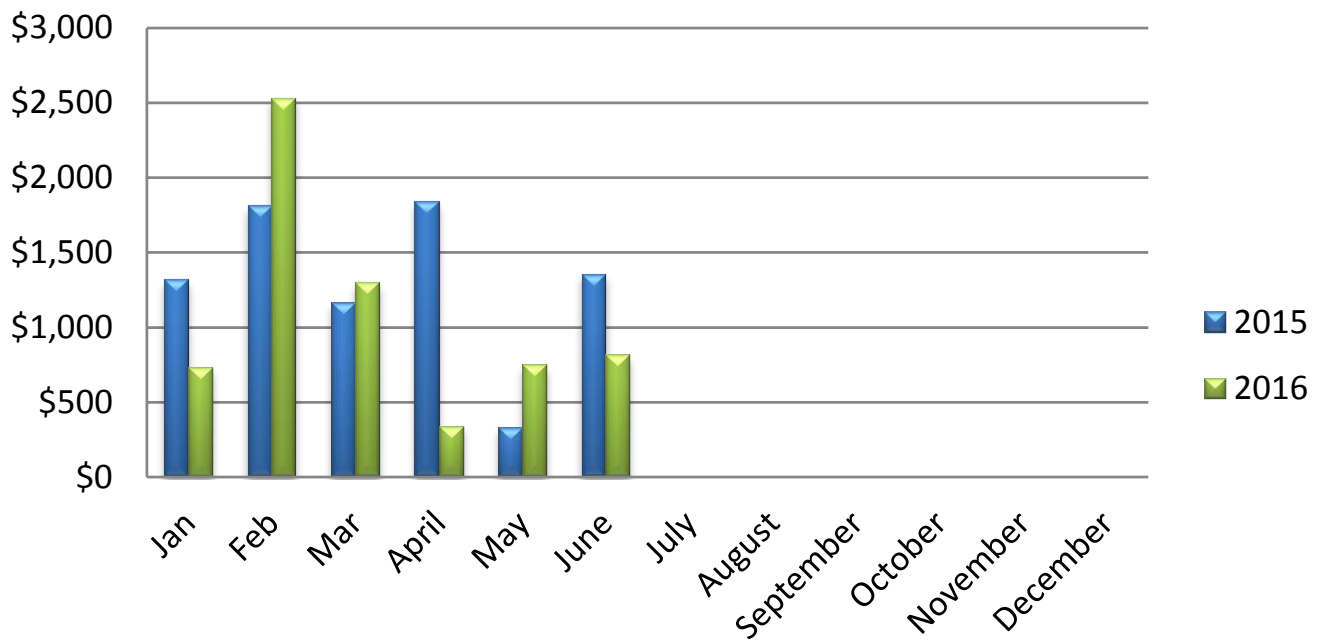
Patrol Overtime

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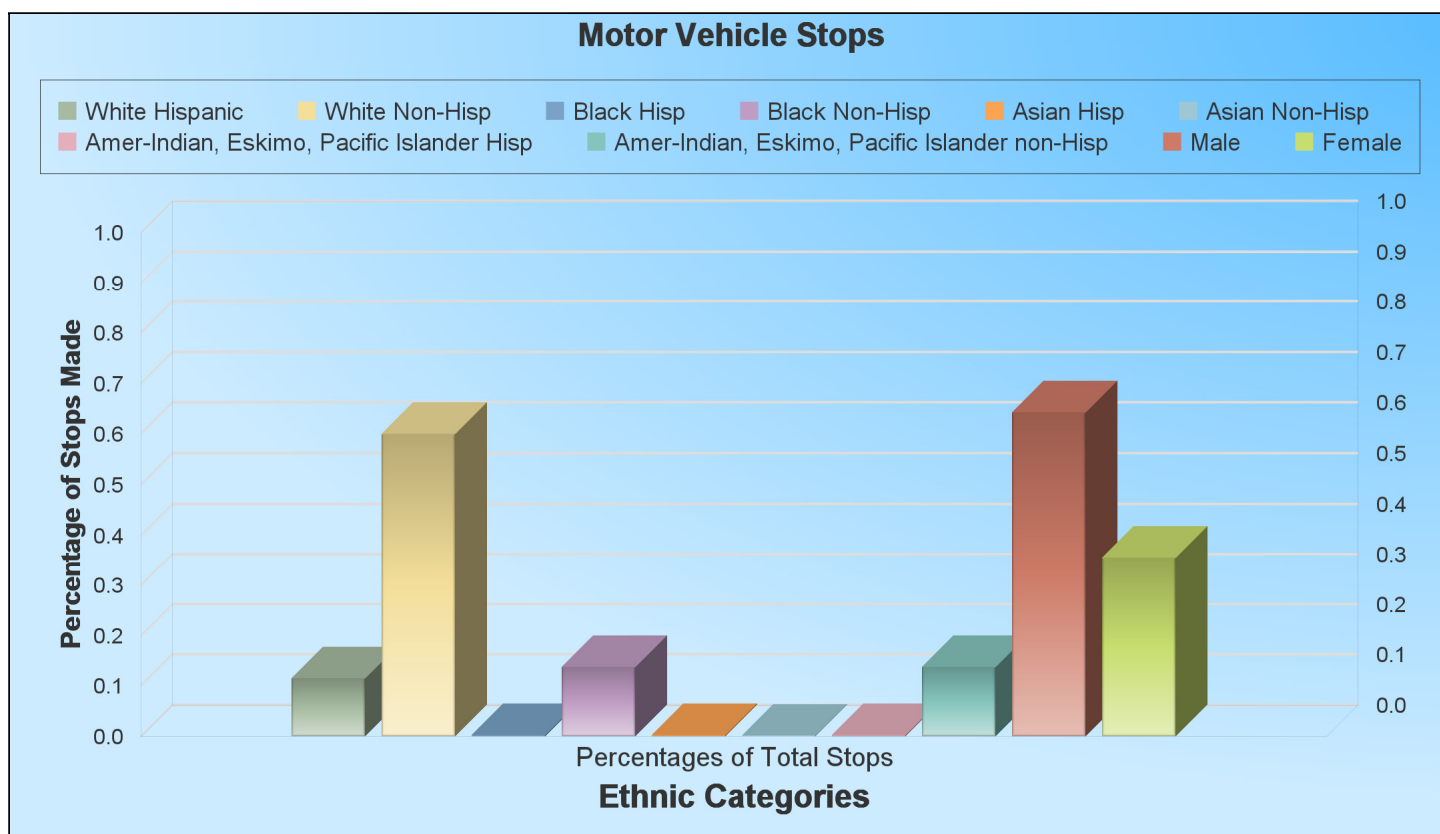

- ❖ On Tuesday, June 14, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended In-service training for the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force at the Princeton University Stadium. The training was hosted by the Princeton Police Department, with the authorization and assistance by Princeton University Public Safety, and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit.

- ❖ On Friday, June 24, 2016 Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to the area of Mercer St. and Quaker Rd., in response to a medical patient with a violent history who fled from a transport ambulance while traveling to a medical facility. K-9 Harris was deployed for an attempted track of the subject.
