Juvenile Report-March 2016

Juveniles Petitioned to Family Court

A seventeen year old boy was charged with Urinating in Public, Possession of CDS and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia after he was seen urinating on Nassau Street while smoking marijuana from a vapor pipe. Additionally he was in possession of a marijuana pipe and two containers of raw marijuana.

A seventeen year old boy was charged with Possession of CDS and Lewdness after a woman driving on Rt. 206 reported a couple was publicly engaged in a sexual act in Community Park South in daylight and he was found to be in possession of marijuana.

A 13 year old boy and a 14 year old boy were charged with Disorderly Conduct and Criminal Mischief after they repeatedly through rocks and marbles at people walking on Nassau Street and vehicles. The window of a Crowne Plaza Transportation Van was broken causing \$424.69 in damages.

Juveniles Afforded a Station House Adjustment

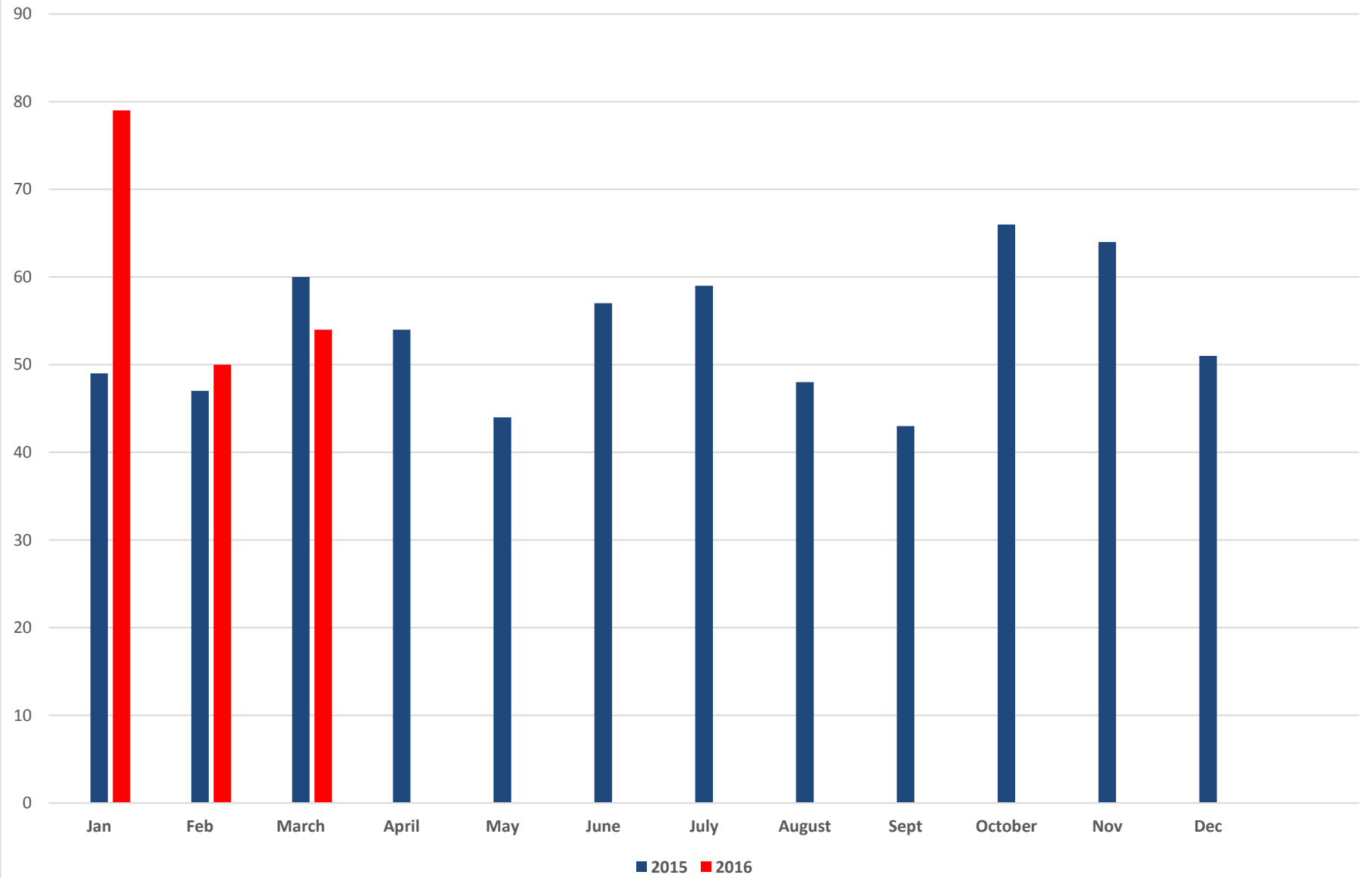
Juvenile Family Crisis

A DCP&P referral was made for a sixteen year old girl who reported she was physically handled by her mother over an academic issue.

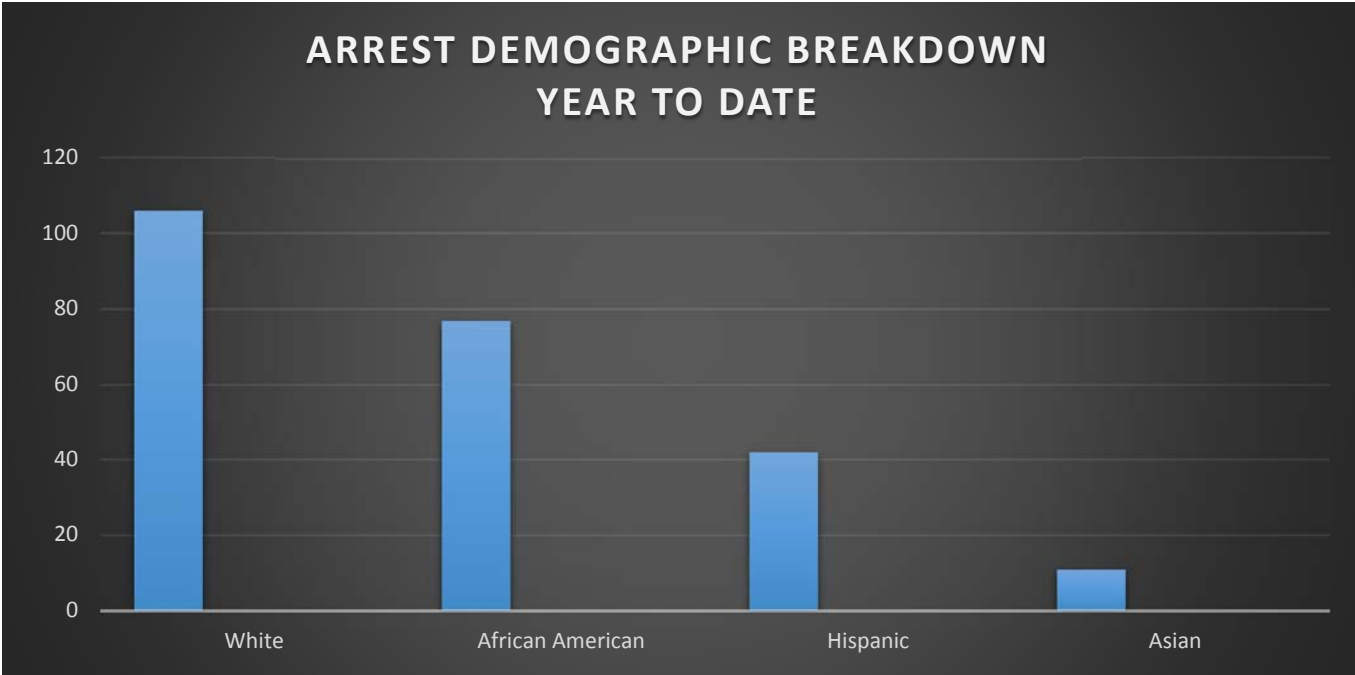

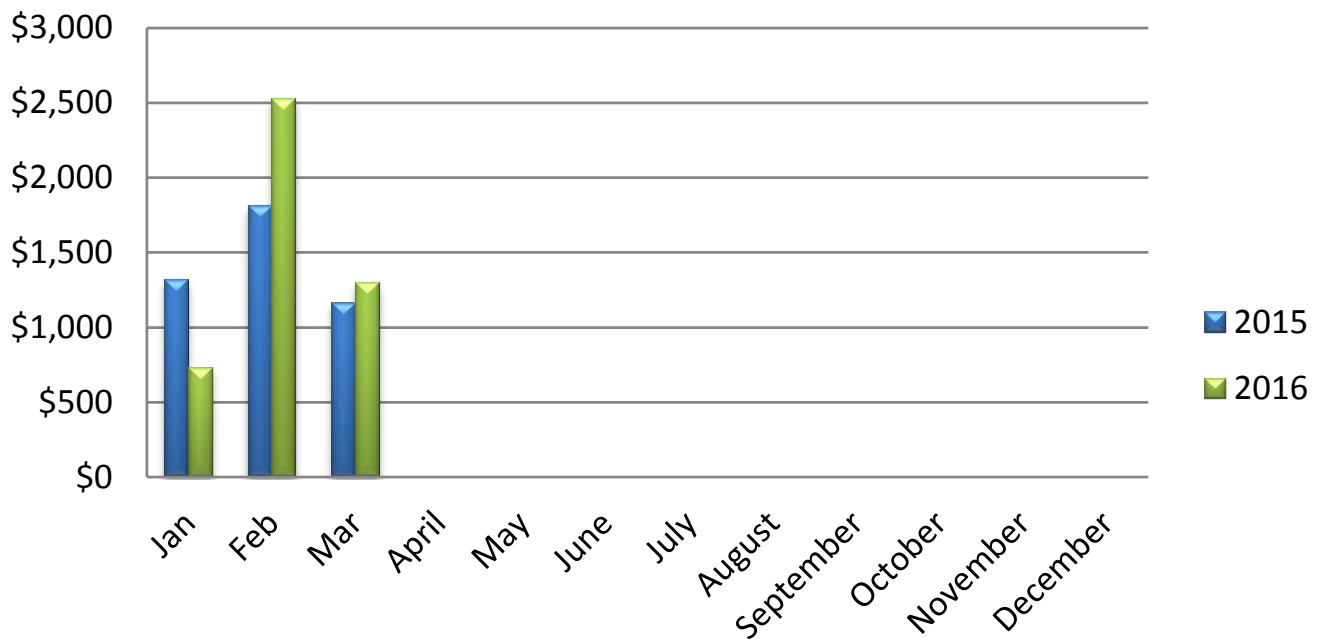
Patrol Overtime

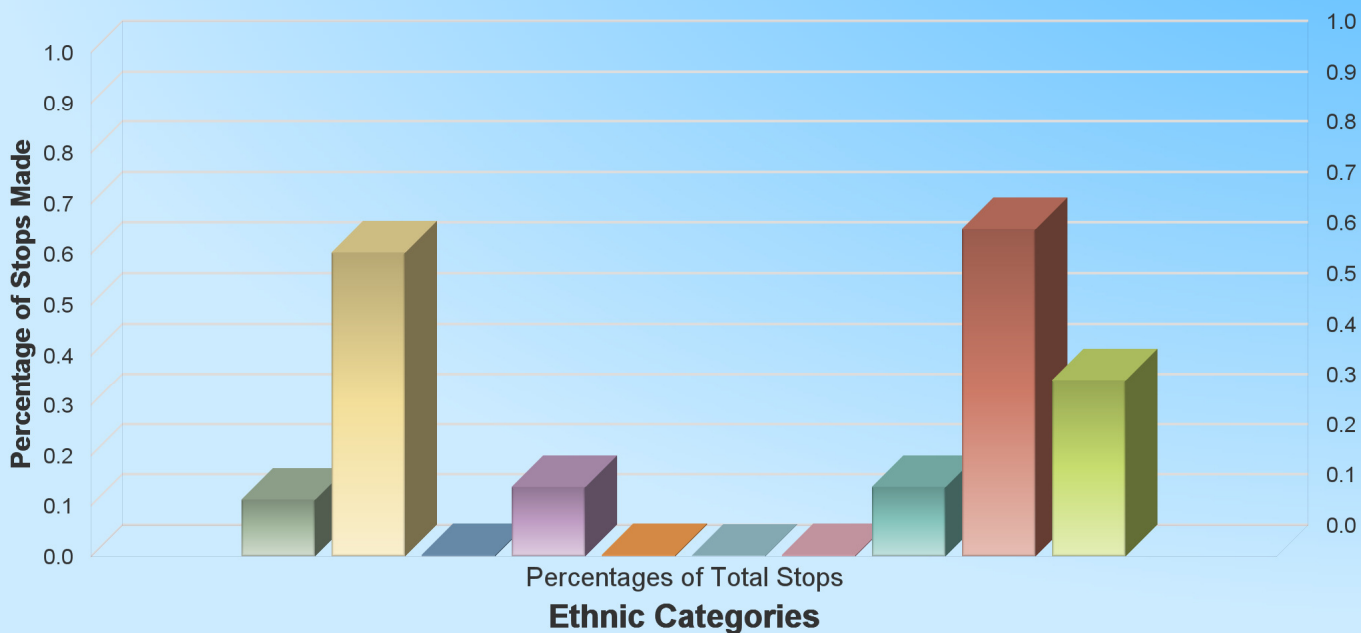

- ❖ On Friday, March 4, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Mercer Rd. near its intersection with Alexander St. in response to an unattended bag. K-9 Harris was deployed for a sniff of the bag and showed no alert. The bag was opened and determined to be an empty suitcase.
- ❖ On Tuesday, March 8, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended in-service training for the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force at iPlay America in Freehold, NJ. The training was hosted by the Monmouth County Sheriff's Department and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit.
- ❖ On Monday, March 21, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris assisted the Mercer County Sheriff's Department with providing a K-9 demonstration for the recruits of the Mercer County Police Academy.
- ❖ On Tuesday, April 12, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended in-service training for the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force at the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Facility in Wrightstown, NJ. The training was hosted and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit.
- ❖ On Sunday, April 17, 2016 Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a proactive explosives sweep in preparation for the Communiversity event. K-9 Teams from the Mercer County Sheriff's Office, West Windsor Police Department, and Kean University Police Department assisted with the sweep. K-9 teams remained on scene throughout the event for public safety.
- ❖ On Sunday, April 17, 2016 Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to the area of Nassau St. and Bank St., during the Communiversity event on a report of an unattended bag. K-9 Harris was deployed for a sniff of the bag

and showed no alert. The bag was opened and determined to be discarded materials.

- ❖ On Thursday, April 28, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a K-9 demonstration at Community Park South in correlation with “Bring your children to work day.” There were approximately 30 attendees at the demonstration. Sgt. Solovay provided a lecture about the K-9 Program discussing the tremendous advantages that the K-9 Unit brings to the police department. Attendees were also provided with a demonstration involving explosives detection, obedience, agility, and criminal apprehension.
