Family Crisis/Mental Health Responses

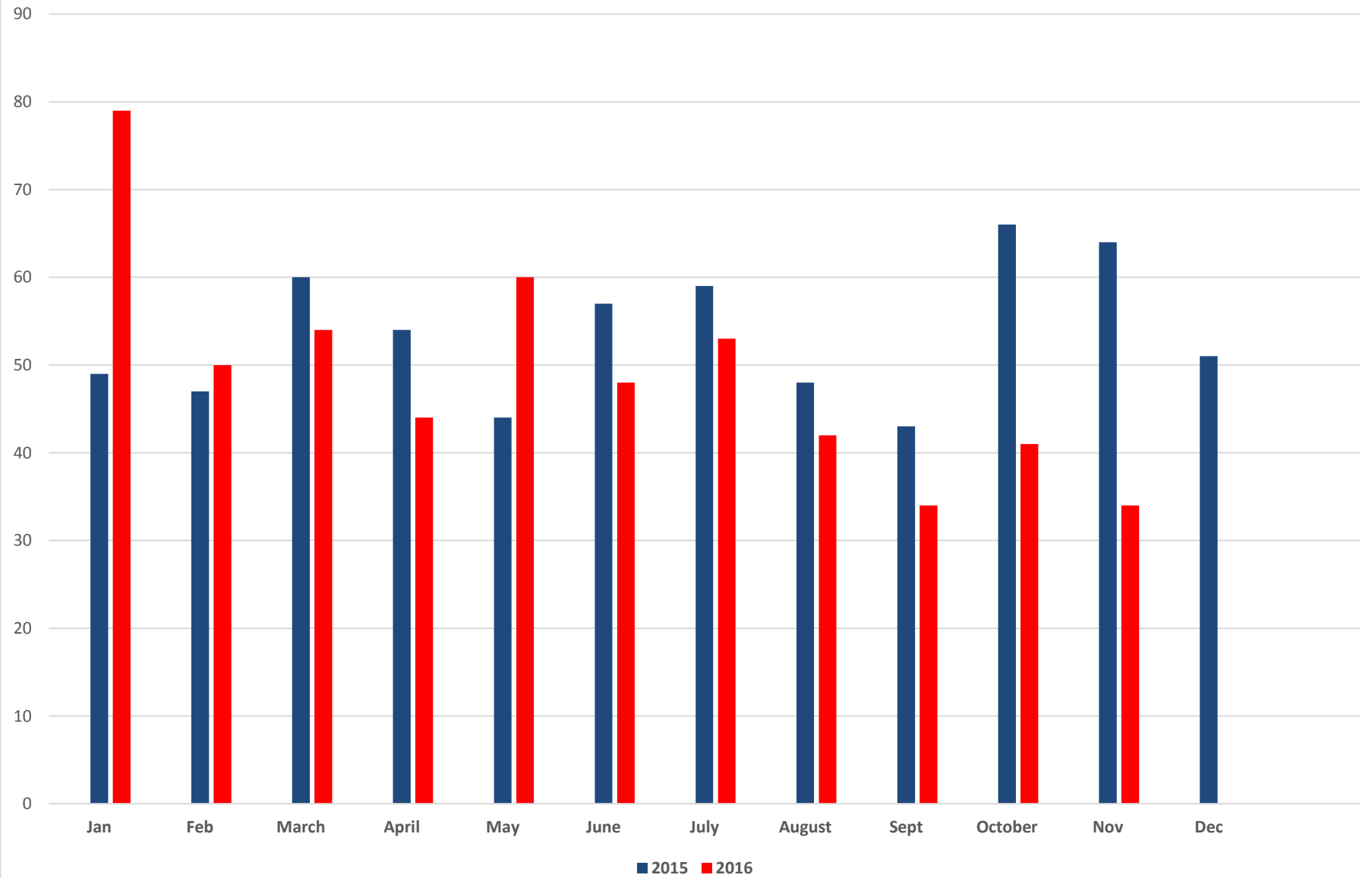
A fourteen year old juvenile expressed suicidal ideation to a police officer and was transported to the University Medical Center of Princeton.

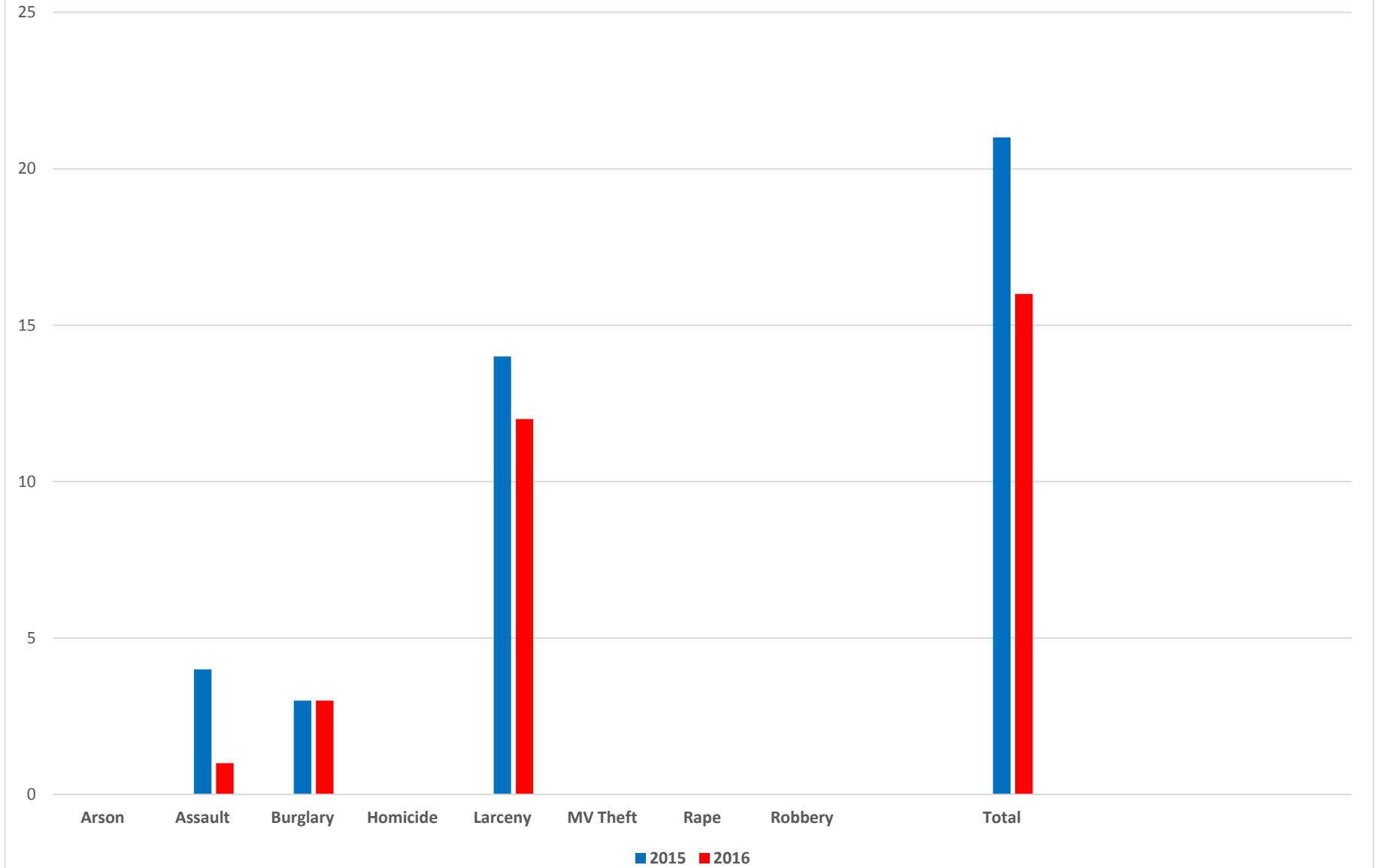

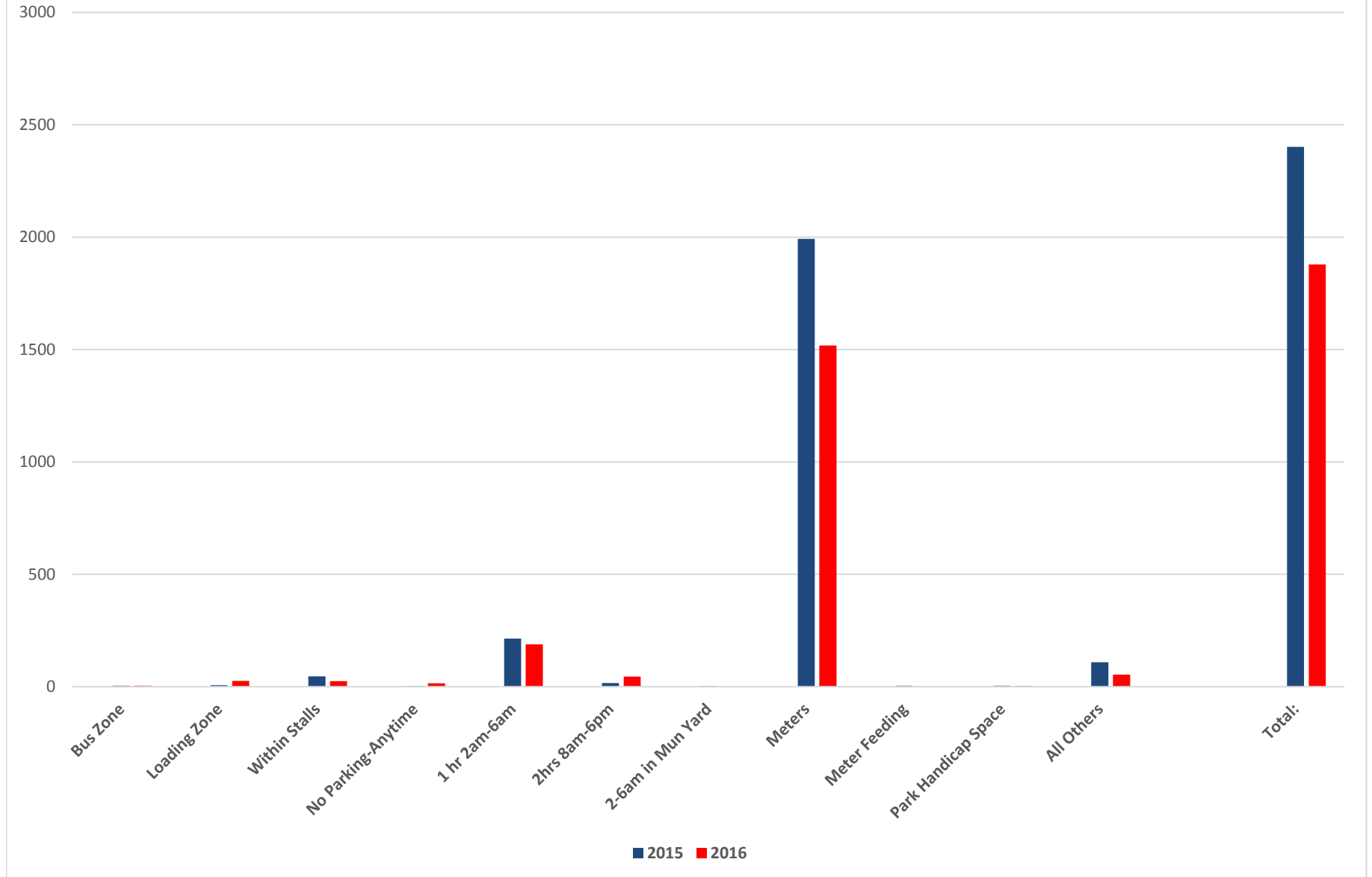

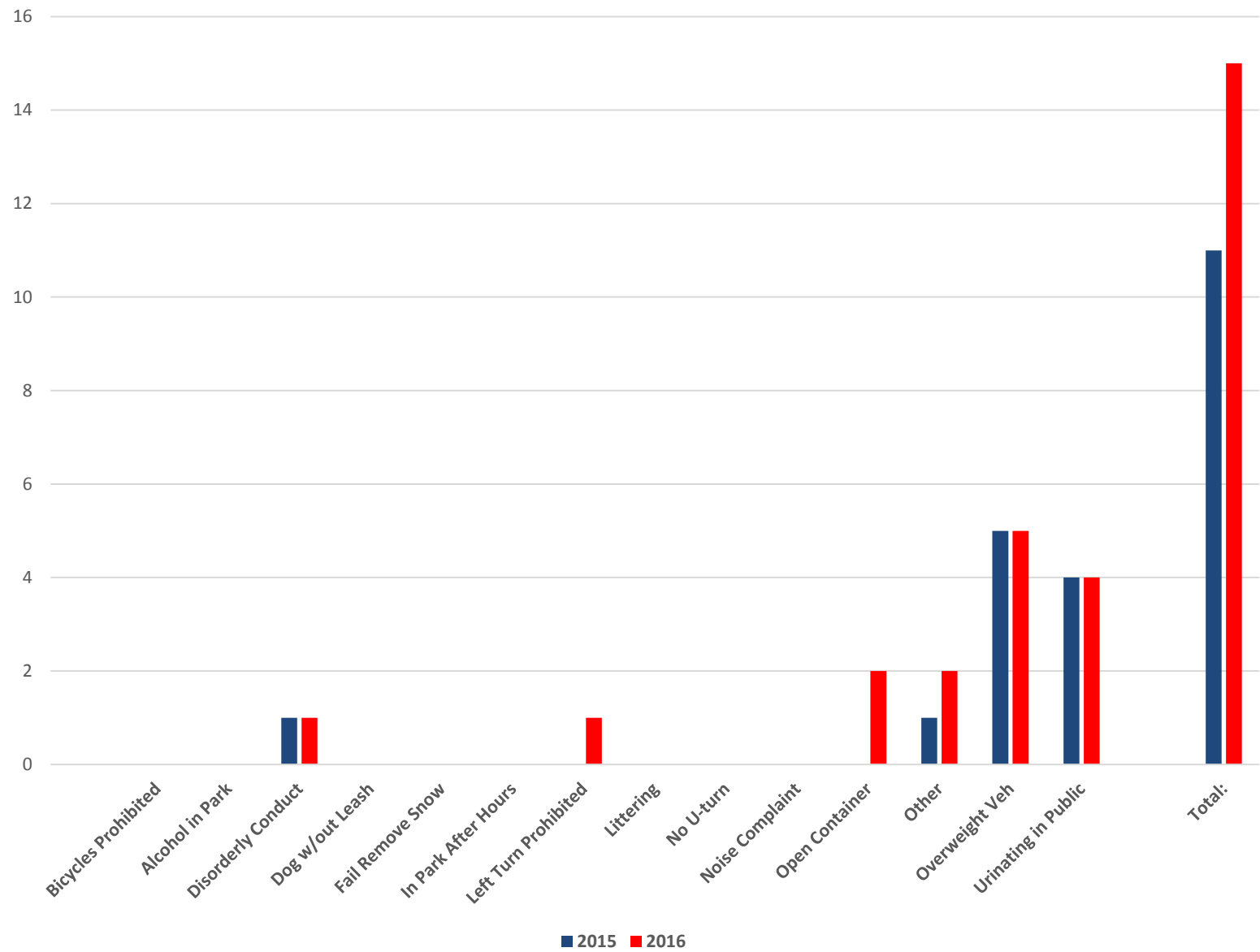

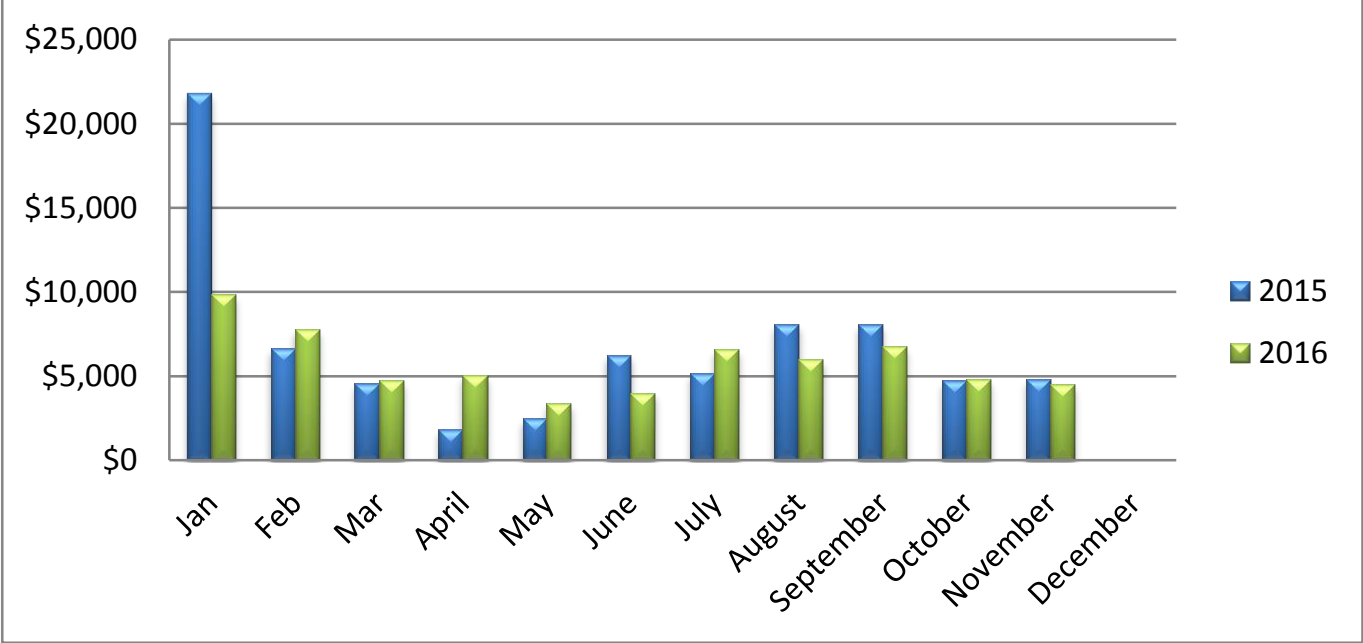

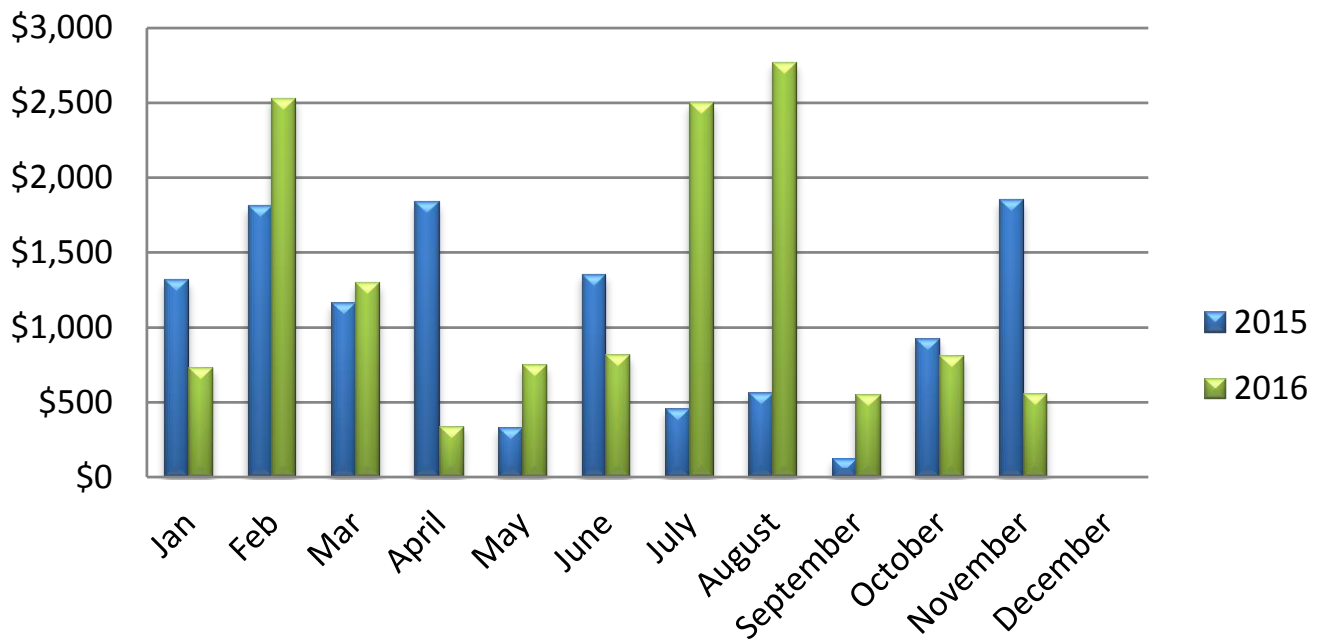
Patrol Overtime

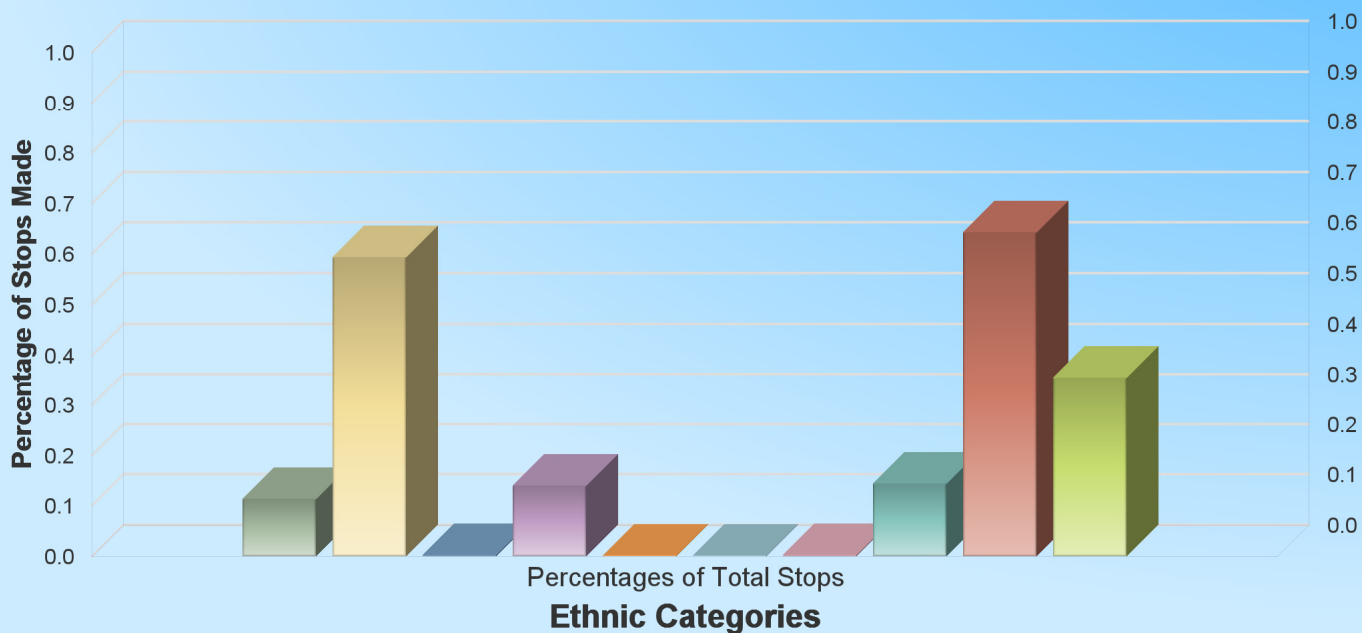

- ❖ On Wednesday, November 23, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Langley Rd. in Kendall Park at the request of the South Brunswick Township Police Department. Upon arrival, officers advised that a criminal suspect fled from police on foot. K-9 Harris initiated a track of the subject but was unable to locate, and it was believed that he had left the area. South Brunswick Police Department's Detective Bureau is conducting an investigation.
- ❖ On Sunday, November 27, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Mercer Rd. after a believed DWI subject fled from police on foot after crashing his vehicle. K-9 Harris initiated a track of the subject and while in the process of canvassing the area, patrols located the involved individual walking on Mercer Rd.
