A fourteen year old boy was charged with Terroristic Threats after he repeatedly threatened physical harm against a twelve year old boy.


Curbside Warnings

A referral to DCP&P was made for a 17 year old girl who reported her mother hit her leg with her hand several times during an argument in the car and caused bruising.


A referral was made to DCP&P for a fourteen year old female who reported non-specific abuse by her mother.



Motor Vehicle Stops



- On Tuesday, October 4, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended Patrol in-service training at the Washington Crossing State Park, located in Hopewell NJ. The training was hosted and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit. The K-9 Teams received training in tracking, field searching, criminal apprehension and obedience work.
- On Friday, October 7, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep of a motorcade at the request of the United States Secret Service. The motorcade staged in the parking lot of Monument Hall, where the sweep took place.
- On Friday, October 7, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep at a residence in the 100 block of Library Place due to an event being attended by Anne Holton, wife of Democratic Vice Presidential nominee Tim Kaine. The sweep was at the request of the United States Secret Service.
- On Friday, October 7, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep at the Nassau Inn due to the visit of Anne Holton, wife of Democratic Vice Presidential nominee Tim Kaine. The sweep was at the request of the United States Secret Service.
- On Saturday, October 8, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep of a motorcade at the Nassau Inn, due to the departure of Anne Holton, wife of Democratic Vice Presidential nominee Tim Kaine. The sweep was at the request of the United States Secret Service.

- On Tuesday, October 11, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Princeton High School on a report of a bomb threat. An unknown actor contacted the police department and the school itself, advising of a threat. Numerous K-9 explosive detection teams responded to the school, including- Princeton Police, Mercer County Sheriffs, and the New Jersey State Police. The K-9 teams cleared the entire school and found nothing suspicious. Students and faculty were then permitted to return to the school. The incident remains under investigation by the Princeton Police Department Detective Bureau.
- On Wednesday, October 19, 2016, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended inservice training for the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force. The training was hosted and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit. Additionally, K-9 Teams in attendance received an incident debrief by the New Jersey State Police Bomb Squad in regards to the bombing incident which occurred in Seaside, New Jersey. After the debrief and general in-service, the K-9 Teams trained with the New Jersey State Police TEAMs Unit in regards to dual response to bomb related incidents.
