Juveniles Referred to Family Court



Family Crisis/Mental Health Crisis


A seventeen year old girl was transported to the hospital for a psychiatric evaluation after her mother reported she threatened to jump out of their car.

- On Friday, April 7, 2017, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Nassau St. in the area of Palmer Square for an unattended bag that was called into police by a concerned citizen. The area was temporarily closed off and K-9 Harris conducted a sniff of the large bag, showing no alert. The bag was later checked and retrieved by patrols.
- On Tuesday, April 11, 2017, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended K-9 training for the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force in Trenton, NJ. The training was hosted by the Trenton Police Department and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit.
- On Sunday, April 30, 2017, Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a proactive explosives sweep in preparation for the Communiversity event. Additionally, the K-9 team remained on scene throughout the event for public safety.
- On Sunday, April 30, 2017 Sgt. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to the area of Nassau St. and Witherspoon St, during the Communiversity Event, on a report of an unattended bag. K-9 Harris was deployed for a sniff of the bag and showed no alert. The owner was eventually located and the bag was subsequently turned over.
