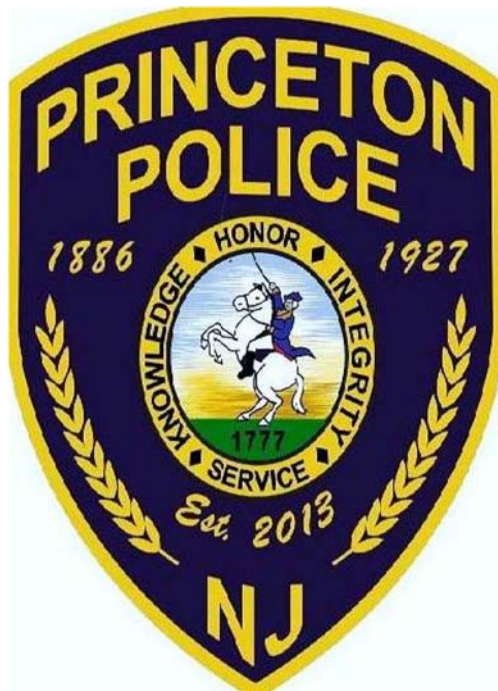

# Safe Neighborhood Bureau Monthly Report

## January 2017

- **January 26<sup>th</sup>** - SNB met with JW Witherspoon Health teacher regarding an 8<sup>th</sup> grade substance abuse presentation. SNB attended the Committed and Faithful Princetonian’s meeting.

- **January 30<sup>th</sup>** – SNB attended the Human Services partners meeting.

### **Juvenile Report January 2017**

#### **Juveniles Petitioned to Family Court**

A seventeen year old female was charged with Possession of CDS (marijuana) and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia after she was pulled over for talking on her cell phone while driving. She was additionally issued motor vehicle tickets for Possession of CDS in a Motor Vehicle and Cell Phone Use while Driving.

A seventeen year old male was charged with Possession of CDS (marijuana), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Underage Possession of Alcohol after he drove his vehicle to a secluded dead end street with a friend and was discovered during routine patrol. He was additionally issued a motor vehicle summons for Possession of CDS in a Motor Vehicle.

#### **Curbside Warning**

A thirteen year old boy was given a curbside warning after he attempted to steal a ball valued at \$1.99 from Jazams toy store.

#### **Family Crisis/Mental Health**

Police were called to a residence to intervene in a verbal altercation between a mother and her seventeen year old daughter after the mother became concerned it would turn physical. The situation was diffused and they were referred to family counseling.

A fifteen year old girl barricaded herself in a room with medication and threatened to harm herself. An officer gained entry to the room and the child was transported to the hospital for evaluation and treatment.

Patrols conducted a welfare check on a 17 year old boy sitting by the Riverside School with no shoes and not dressed appropriately for the weather. The boy had engaged in a physical and verbal fight with his brother and subsequently left the house. He was transported home and turned over to the custody of his parents.

Police responded to a report of a sixteen year old boy having an argument with his mother and destroying property in the house. Upon realizing the police were responding, the boy retrieved a large knife from the

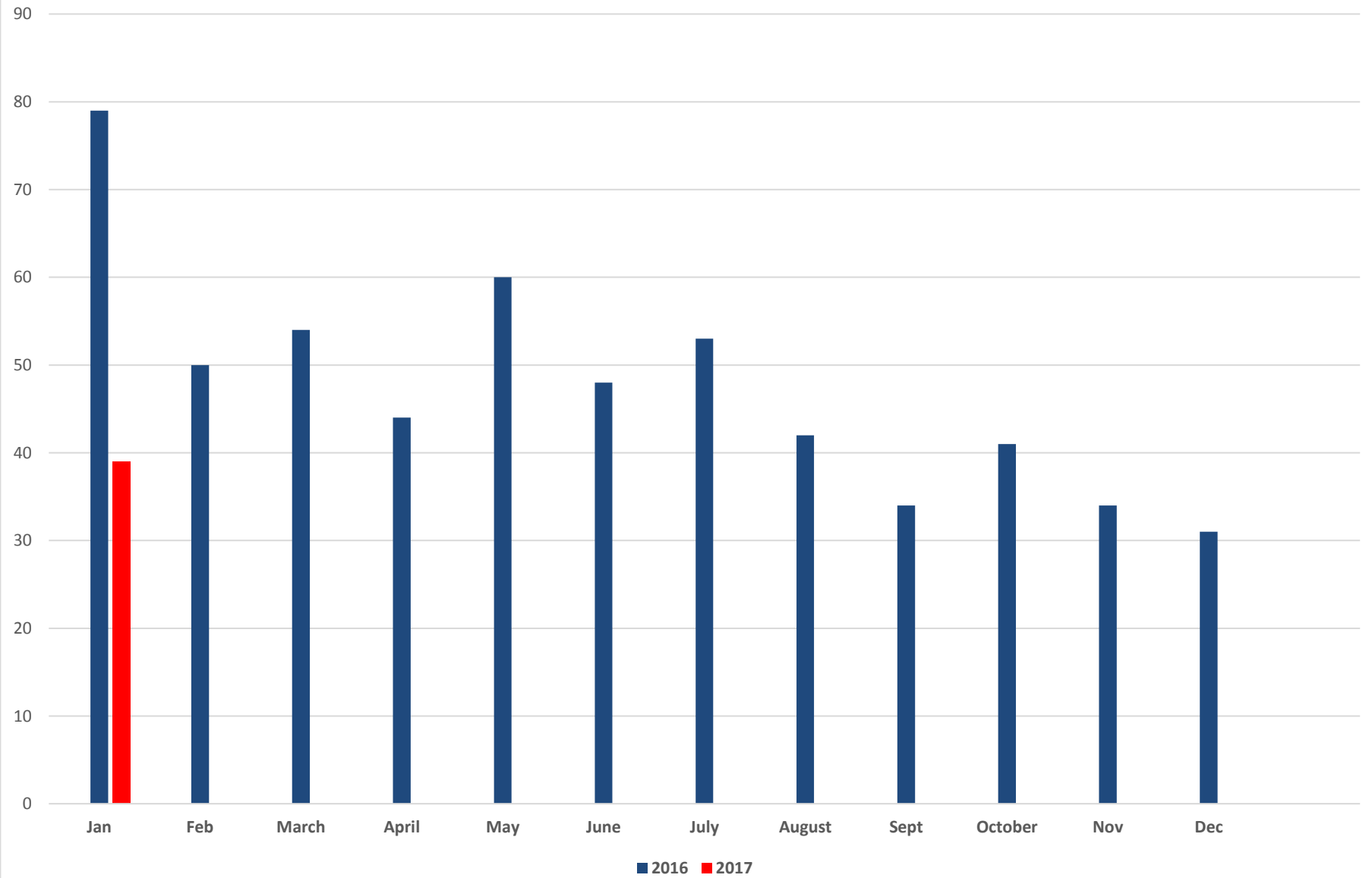
kitchen and sat on the couch. Patrols were able to verbally de-escalate the situation and he was transported to the hospital for psychiatric evaluation.

### **DCP&P Referrals**

A referral was made for two thirteen year old boys who took a bus from Trenton to Princeton without the permission of their parents. Upon becoming stranded in Princeton the boys attempted to walk home to Hamilton however became too cold as they did not have proper winter attire. The boys knocked on a random door for assistance and the resident contacted police who subsequently brought them to the police station and arranged for parental pickup.

A referral to DCP&P was made for a fourteen year old girl who reported her father verbally threatened her.

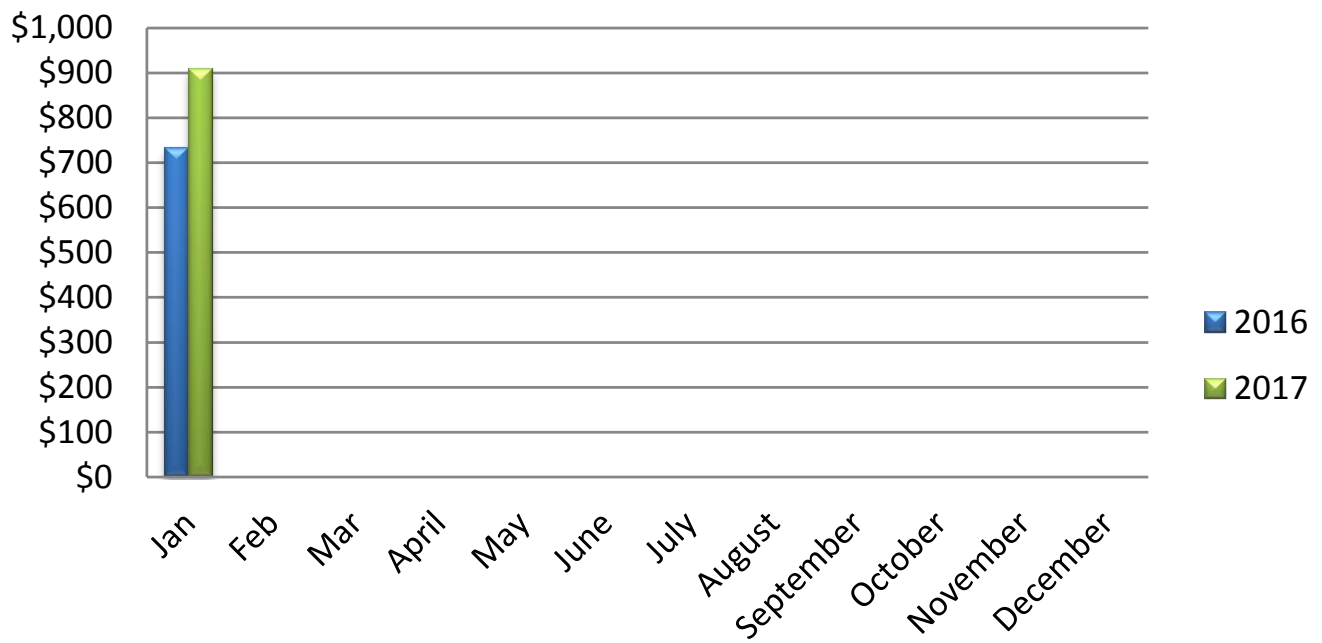

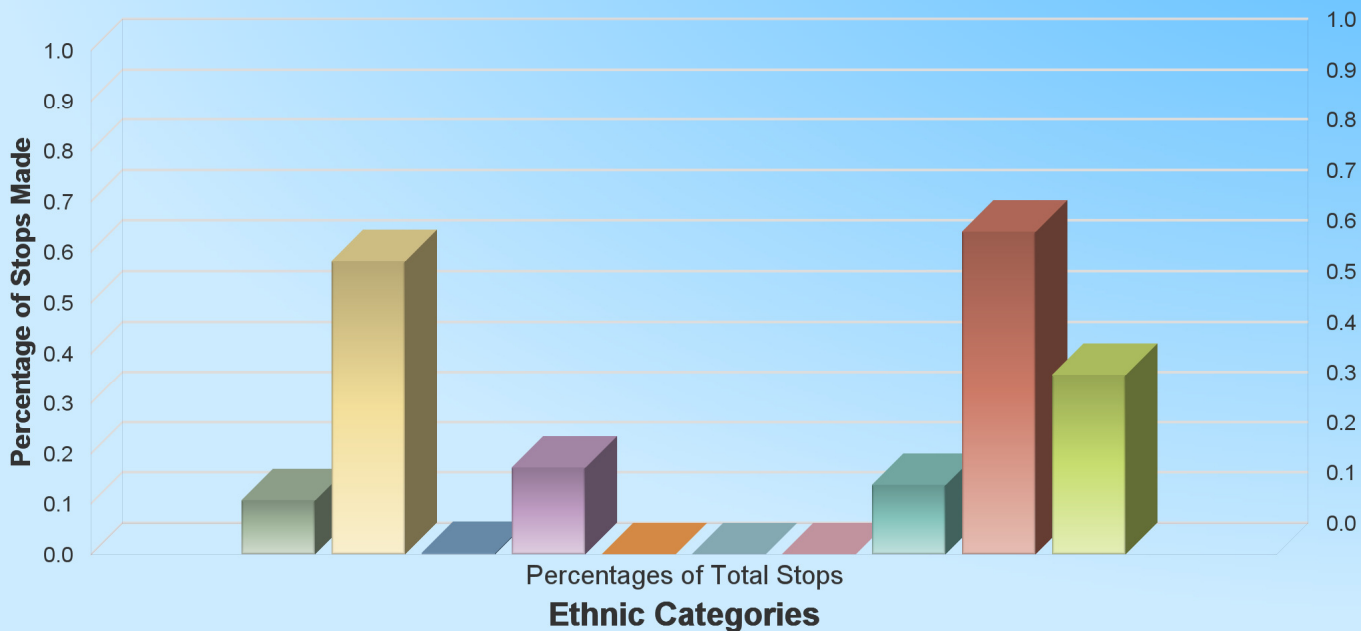
